




### **Strategic Planning - Member Satisfaction Survey**



6. How would you best like to use the ESAC meeting time? (Check your top 4 choices.)










## **Food Update**



## Safe Routes to School Updates

- We have gone almost completely digital!
- Non-digital:
  - Crossing guards are still at their posts
  - Staff is available to do traffic observations if requested by school administration







## Digital SRTS

- Lessons for elementary students will be available on our website and have been emailed to PE teachers
- "SRTS 101" and "Traffic Safety 101" PowerPoint presentations will be available on our website in English and Spanish, and staff will be available for "live" presentations in either language via online meetings
- Walk to School Day will be fully online this year. SRTS staff will do a "take over" of Public Works social media to offer tips on how to walk to school safely during this pandemic and to showcase previous Walk to School Day celebrations

## **Developing Best Practices: Meals in the Classroom**

### Supplies:

- Compostable liner bags
  - Provided by campus Food Services staff
- Signs for 3-stream bins,
  - Print from <u>AISD's zero waste toolkit</u>

#### Optional, campus discretion:

- Hallway zero waste station
  - Compost bins ordered, when available, using <u>the</u> <u>link https://goo.gl/skA61z</u>
- A compost collection bin/bucket for each classroom
  - Reuse or repurpose for buckets









## Zero Waste news



- Campus compost pick-up service resumes upon student return, improving diversion rates.
  - Looking for post-consumer source of buckets for classrooms to adapt to new meals procedure

## Community Engagement & Outreach Spring 2020 CE+O Member Survey

- Launched after completing an initial membership analysis
- Shared out in March (by email) and at the May Meeting
- 21 total responses of ~40 ESAC members
- The survey offered insights on:
  - ways to further support ESAC members
  - metrics being tracked by current members
  - next steps for the CE+O Subcommittee







## Community Engagement & Outreach PROPOSED STEPS FORWARD

- Review AISD Sustainability Plan against COA Climate Equity Plan.
- Consider our role and priorities in relation to our new reality: How can we connect our focus to the COVID-19 world? Consider the connections between environmental issues, equity, and the pandemic. Consider green jobs, just transitions.
