



Wrapping up 2022 - Planning for 2023

- Yesterday was our Annual Sliced and Diced Competition at ACC Highland with our Middle School Culinary students. The winning burrito winner was Kealing Middle School!
- In May we began work with the Humane Society to track our plant based options. With this measurable data we can work to increase our options with each new season. (We always offer a vegetarian option, but it may not always be plant-based.)
- We made a tracker for our dish machine use to determine which schools are not using dishwashers at all, are using them some, do not have dishwashers, or have dishwashers in disrepair. Again, this gives us a chance to track improvements with each season
- We will be serving meals at 70 locations this Summer, healthy eating is year round!



























- We have planned menus for SY22-SY23 and will be offering self serve, bulk raw veggies and fruits at all locations, eliminating most of the single-use containers once used for these menu items
- We have completed a bid for additional squeeze bottles and sauce dispensers to support our self service condiments initiative, which also reduces single use containers
- We have a few fun end of the year recipes for the Spring cycle like these refreshing housemade Strawberry Sorbets, a Spicy Chicken Sandwich, and Chili with Cornbread
