Food Updates

- We presented our progress with Sustainability at the Green Schools Conference in New Orleans alongside 2 representatives from the Center for Environmental Health
- We will be celebrating School Breakfast Week during 3/6-3/10 by having a special menu of Housemade Cinnamon Twists with Chocolate Chickpea spread, samplings of our Mango Smoothies, and serving Breakfast for Lunch at all Elementary and Middle Schools
- We got our shipment of reusable label bands to use for our bulk condiment stations that we purchased with a grant from the COA Office of Sustainability. This initiative has allowed us greatly reduce our use of single use containers saving time, labor, and trash!



Nature Updates

- More big news! Discovery Hill Outdoor Learning Center is moving this summer. Our new home will be the former Metz Elementary. We are excited for the opportunity this presents and the new space we will create to host field trips there centered around nature discovery and sensory play.
- The Girls Outside program has been a blast! So far, we have taken 320 girls from 10 schools on a combined 15 field trips to McKinney Falls, Discovery Hill, and Zilker Botanical Gardens. This spring, we will be visiting Westcave Preserve and Camacho Center.
- Spring It's My Park Day had a record number of participating schools! I co-led a workday at Guerrero-Thompson Elementary, pictured here. Our team of volunteers removed trash from the creek that flows through the campus (including a mattress!), cleared an overgrown courtyard, and prepped garden beds for students. The following Monday, students planted their spring veggies, herbs and flowers!
- Green School Parks Designation We are thrilled that so many schools are applying! We currently have 13 additional schools under review to become GSPs.
- Because we know that time outside is integral to our social and emotional health, we will be presenting at AISD's SEL Symposium in June to encourage more time outside during the school day for ALL of our students!



Zero Waste Updates

- We have <u>updated sorting signs</u>! They are available to all teachers, staff, and students in the zero waste toolkit (see right side of <u>this web page</u>).
- Assessment visits have been performed at high schools by the Zero Waste Lead Ana Echeverria to encourage, promote, and enforce Waste Sorting practices at the district, while engaging personnel to commit to AISD Zero Waste strategies.
- "Reusing" has become part of the strategies promoted by Austin ISD during the 2022-2023 year. With the help of Housekeeping Operations personnel, the Energy & Water Department and our painting shop, AISD Zero Waste have distributed 7-gallon bins adapted for recycling at elementary schools. These bins, originally intended for landfill, were donated to the school district through National Instruments, and have been repurposed, saving money to the school district and diverting resources from the landfill.
