AISD maintains several standing (ongoing) advisory bodies, as well as some ad hoc (limited time) advisory bodies. These groups provide an important source of stakeholder input to the administration and the Board. Attached is an at-a-glance summary of the standing AISD advisory bodies.

District Policy BDF(Local) assigns the administration of each advisory body to either the Superintendent or the Board, and provides standards and expectations for all AISD advisory bodies, including websites, formal bylaws (for standing advisory bodies) or charters (for ad hoc advisory bodies), open meetings, and biennial sunset reviews. Although each advisory body has its own specialized staff assigned to it for support, the Superintendent ensures that a Coordinator of District Advisory bodies provides general oversight for implementation of policy BDF(Local).

- Links to individual websites for all district advisory bodies
- Standard application form
- Guidelines for visitors and public comments
- Work of previous district advisory bodies
- Resources for advisory body coordinators

The membership lists for advisory bodies, included on each of their websites, note any vacancies. Persons interested in serving on one or more district-level advisory bodies are invited to complete and submit an online application. The Coordinator enters this information into a database, which is available to the support staff for all advisory bodies when they are looking to fill vacancies.

There are a couple of important points to keep in mind:

- Even if there are currently no vacancies, interested persons are encouraged to still submit an application should vacancies arise, which is often the case.
- Submitting an application in itself does not guarantee service on a district
 advisory body. In many cases, advisory bodies are seeking representation for
 specific geographic areas (such as vertical teams or Trustee districts), specific
 membership categories (such as parents or business members), or specific
 experience or expertise.

Please note that if you are interested in serving on a Campus Advisory Council (CAC), there is a separate process. There is a CAC membership application form on the CAC webpage at: http://www.austinisd.org/advisory-bodies/cac. Completed CAC



application forms are submitted directly to individual campus offices. Please consult the CAC website for more information.

In accordance with policy BDF(Local), all regular business meetings of AISD advisory bodies are open to the public. In addition to observing, persons wishing to attend a regular meeting of an advisory body may sign up to speak during public comments and/or fill out a written comment card. Please consult the guidelines available on the main website.
