With the spring semester well underway, Austin ISD is proud to share the latest updates for the 2017 Bond Program. Working with our school communities, we've made significant progress on the modernization projects included in the bond, with 18 modernization and targeted projects underway—and several already moving into construction.

AISD's bond program was informed by the district's <u>2017 Facility Master Plan</u>, a high-level, long-term plan for all district facilities during the next two decades. Trustees approved the district's FMP, which includes regular updates every two years.

The 2019 FMP update is underway. Its main focus is the addition of master plans to support and strengthen districtwide priorities in the areas of:

- athletics, fitness and wellness;
- career and technical education, including career-centered learning and a range of pathways for students to explore industry opportunities; and,
- fine arts, including the visual and performing arts, as well as creative learning.

This collaborative work is being shaped with guidance from the trustee-appointed community members serving on the Facilities and Bond Planning Advisory Committee, district team members and our communities across Austin.

We're only a few months into 2019, but it has already been a busy year. Many modernization projects have kicked off and are now in the design phase, including:

- Hill Elementary School Estimated completion date: August 2021
- Health Science School at LBJ Early College High School Estimated completion date: January 2022
- Metz-Sanchez-Zavala Elementary School Estimated completion date: August 2021
- Rosedale School Estimated completion date: August 2021

AISD also has celebrated two project milestones since the start of the year. The groundbreaking of the new Eastside Memorial Early College High School and International High School at the Original L.C. Anderson Campus was held Jan. 19. This special event brought all three school communities together to reflect on the past, celebrate the present and prepare for the future together.

On Feb. 22, the Ann Richards School for Young Women Leaders hosted their groundbreaking ceremony, which celebrated the Groundbreaking Women who have laid the foundation for today's students. Honorees included AISD's Chief Business and Operations Officer Nicole Conley Johnson, ARS founding principal Jeanne Goka, ARS Foundation board member and past chair Michelle Milford Morse, and Ann Richard's daughter Ellen Richards, who was instrumental in launching the school. The event also included a performance by the Tiarra Girls, an Austin Latina rock band comprising ARS students and alumnae.

PROJECT SPOTLIGHT

The Ann Richards School for Young Women Leaders is committed to building the community and to changing the world. Students in sixth through 12th grade from throughout Austin are preparing for college through rigorous academics and real-world service projects. For the 2017 Bond, the campus will undergo Phase 1 of a strategic modernization to create a state-of-the-art campus at its current site.

The Ann Richards School community held its groundbreaking ceremony in February, celebrating the project as it moves into the final stages of design and construction begins. Design highlights of the modernized school include support for project-based and authentic learning, a culture of making, areas for community gathering and new athletic fields. The new facility will have increased capacity to support 1,050 students.

Phase 1 of the modernized Ann Richards School is set to open in January 2021.

DID YOU KNOW?

Career and Technical Education provides students with the academic knowledge and technical skills they need to gain entry to high-skill, high-wage and high-demand industries. CTE programs provide work-based learning experiences that combine hands-on learning with real-world scenarios so students are prepared to enter the workforce or college after they graduate high school.

AISD offers recommended sequences of courses based on student interests, goals and aptitudes, which align to 16 nationally recognized career clusters that guide students through a planned program of study. CTE courses are dynamic and engaging, giving students a platform to find their passion and make a career of it. With options for earning college credit, industry credentials and postsecondary awards (such as certifications and associate degrees), CTE helps all students prepare for college, career and life.
