

Summary of Recent Changes to CAC Bylaws

Following are the main changes made recently to CAC bylaws. There are also several minor “housekeeping” changes that are not summarized.

Article/Section	Summary of Changes
I/Four	This section added to describe CAC audit process. The process is not new, but included in bylaws for information.
III/Eight	Examples of excused absences added.
III/Thirteen	Requirement removed to physically post most current set of minutes.
IV/One (Item 1)	Since out-of-district enrollment is encouraged, requirement removed for parents to live within district. Also changed “must be a custodial parent of guardian” to “must stand in parental relation” (in other words, a person may for all practical purposes serve in a parental role, but not have custody).
IV/One (Item 5)	Clarifies that the community representative may be from a public-sector agency (such as a city or county).
IV/Two	Added language to highly encourage written and consistently applied member selection considerations (with example on CAC webpage).
IV/Eight	Clarifies that members may be selected prior to the start of a new school year.
IV/Fourteen	Clarifies that code of conduct applies not just during meetings, but at all times, and includes conduct toward all persons associated with the district.
V/One	Clarifies that co-chairs may be elected prior to the start of a new school year.
VI/Three	This section added to provide an appeals process for members dismissed for non-attendance.
VI/Four	This section added to provide a waiver process from bylaws provisions not required by statute or policy.
VI/Five	This section added to describe process for CACs to request items on DAC agenda. This process is not new, but included in bylaws for information.
