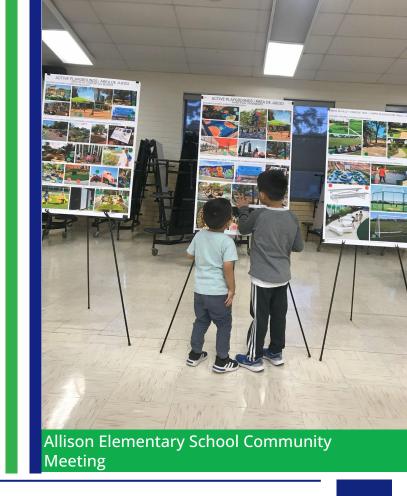

### Non-Construction Related Expenses



#### **Program Wide Expenses**

- Communications
  - Funding for outside consultants that work closely with Construction Mgmt, Implementation and Communication, and AISD Comms (DCCE). This also covers other communications expenses.
- Legal Services
  - Funding for outside Legal Counsel to assist with specialized legal matters such as bond specific questions, construction contracts, etc.
- Construction Inspectors
  - Inspectors that are in the field, coordinating with our project managers and overseeing day-to-day construction to ensure compliance with Construction Documents and with District standards. They are involved in projects from design (giving input on compliance and constructability) through project completion.
  - These have traditionally been contracted services.

### Non-Construction Related Expenses



#### **Program Wide Expenses**

- Safety Inspectors
  - Funding for safety inspectors that are in the field, visiting each job site to verify compliance with OSHA, AISD standards and any other safety related items. They are involved from bid phase through the end of the project
- AISD Bond Staff
  - Funding for AISD staff that are working directly on the bond delivery
- Bond Staff Augmentation
  - Funding for individual project managers that are imbedded in AISD project teams, program management teams, as well as other support staff such as contract and procurement specialists
- Printing, Copying and Solicitation Advertising
- Program Wide Escalation
- Program Wide Contingency

\$25,389 was added to program contingency from 260025 WINN that was then transferred to 240028 WINN in May 2025 to provide adequate funding for wing refresh, specifically regarding an ADA compliant restroom.

\$420,000 was transferred to 240006 CLIFT for revised GMP for additional roofing and switchgear scope added to the project due to campus need.

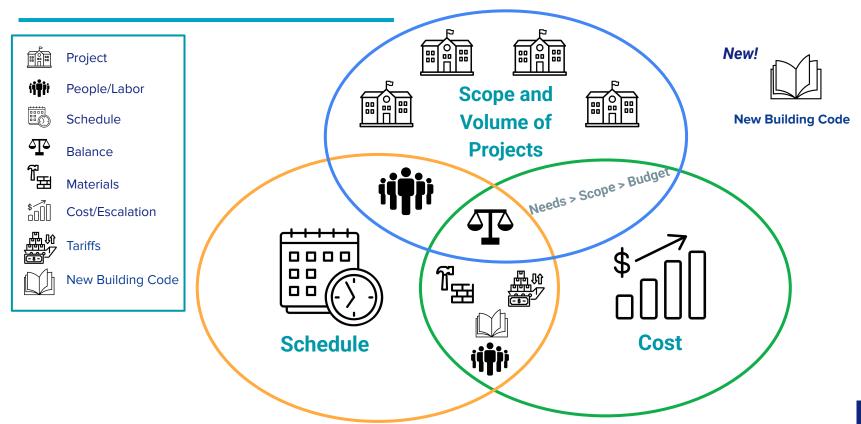

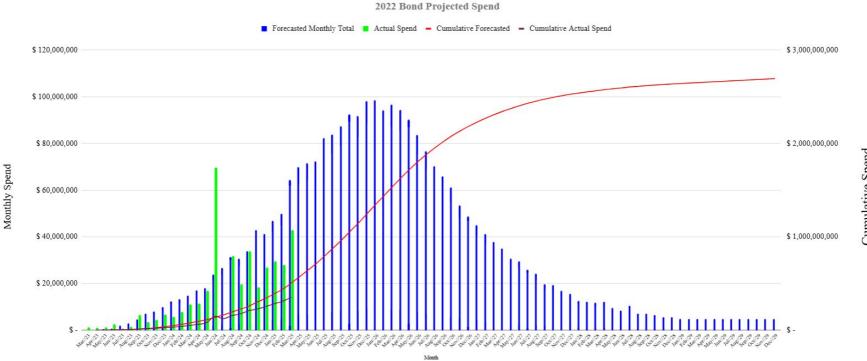

### 2022 Bond Projected & Current Spend



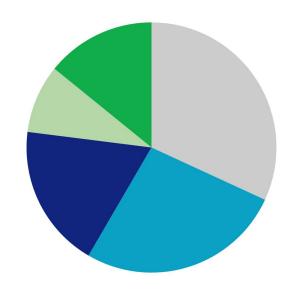

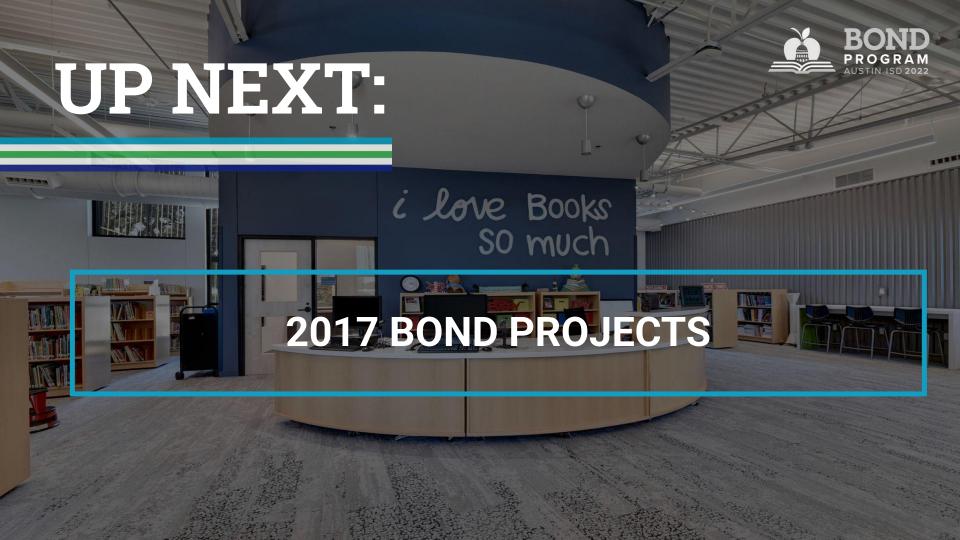

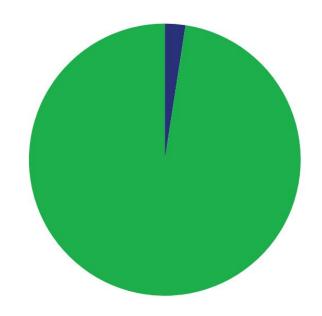

  - COA to perform Final Building Inspection for Final Certificate of Occupancy.

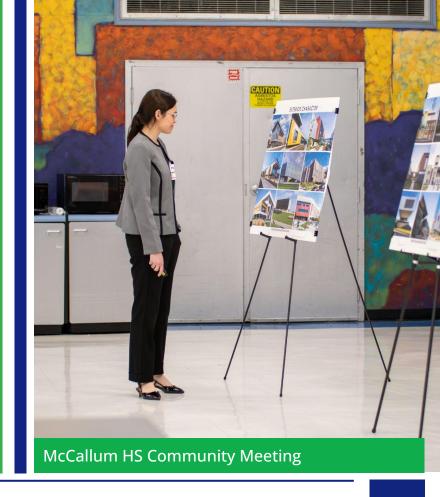
