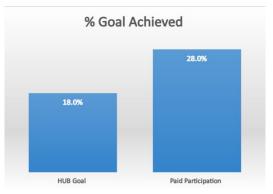

Geotechnical Findings

 Soil composition consists of high moisture content and fatty clay

Drainage Survey Findings

- Expansive soils are causing fluctuations to grading, leading to further drainage issues and water infiltration in the crawl space
- Crawl space drainage is malfunctioning, causing water to settle

Structural Findings

 Pooling water is causing upward force on structural piers, leading to movement of superstructure

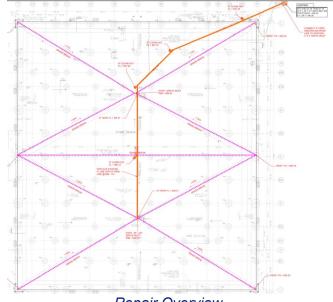

Proposed Repairs Overview

- Install concrete mud slab to properly capture any water infiltration
- Repair to crawlspace retention walls
- Install new drainage in crawl space
- Install new louvers, fans, & sensors to control humidity
- Regrade the perimeter of the building

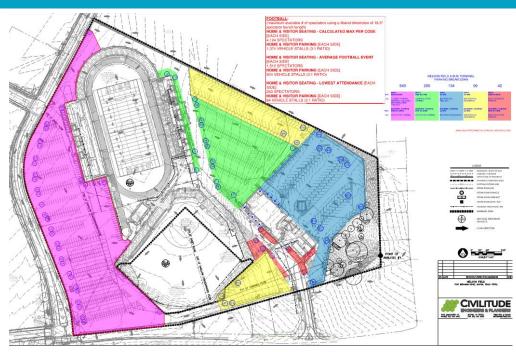

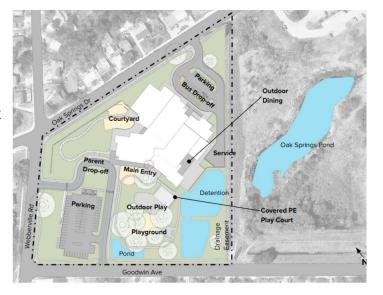

- The Team is evaluating options to reduce project costs without compromising Ed Spec requirements.



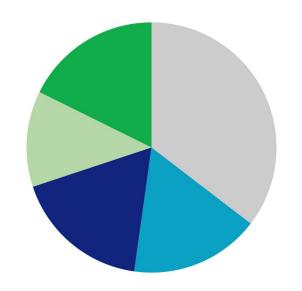

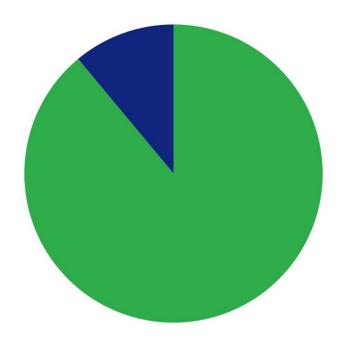

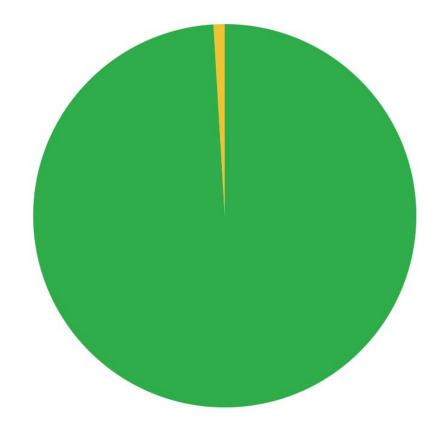
