

AISD SCHOOL TRANSITION PLAN OVERVIEW

Executive Summary

The School Consolidation Transition work is intentionally designed as a direct and necessary step toward realizing the district's vision: ensuring every family has access to an excellent, vibrant, and well-resourced neighborhood school. This initiative is crucial for reinvesting resources strained by budget shortfalls and declining enrollment, delivering financial stability, and enriching academic, arts, and athletic programs across the district. Crucially, the comprehensive transition plan is crafted to meet the unique needs of all invested partners—students, staff, parents, and communities—through individualized, tiered support. Campuses facing school closures are prioritized as the Tier 1 (our highest tier of support). This effort requires the collaboration of multiple departments and meaningful engagement with families and the community to ensure a smooth transition.

Guiding Principles

The guiding principles serve as the foundation for the School Consolidation Transition work, ensuring that every decision and action aligns with the district's vision of providing all families access to excellent, well-resourced neighborhood schools, while respecting cultures of our individual school communities.

- **Equitable Access**: Ensure transition resources and decisions prioritize equitable outcomes for all student groups.
- Transparency: Maintain open, clear, and frequent communication with all stakeholders.
- **Identity Preservation**: Honor the history and traditions of all merging schools.
- Continuity: Ensure seamless continuation of academic and support services.

District and Campus Transition Teams

District Team: The district will establish a transition team to coordinate collaboration across departments and campuses, ensuring a smooth, well-supported process so that every school is fully prepared for a successful start to the 2026–2027 school year.

Campus Team: Campus Principals will select two campus staff members and two caregivers to serve as Campus Ambassadors.

Tiered Support

The district will implement a tiered support model to address the following areas:

- Students & Family Support
- Staff Support
- Enrollment Transition Support
- Community Transition
- Moving Operations and Logistics



Closure and non-zoned campuses will receive Tier 1 support, campuses with significant boundary changes will receive Tier 2 support, and all remaining campuses will receive targeted assistance. We will also maintain a granular, internal tracker of events and supporting activities to ensure that the needs and rhythms of individual school communities are respected. A separate Transition Plan for staff will be provided by the Talent Strategy Department.

This document outlines the proposed timeline, key events, and resources that support a smooth transition for all stakeholders. As the plan is still in development, the included items represent an initial scope and will be expanded upon as we progress in developing our comprehensive plan.

Students & Family Support

Purpose: Ensure continuity, communication, and comfort for students and families during the transition.
