



#### **Educational Suitability Summary Report**

Hart Elementary School, serving a student population of approximately 700 students in Northeast Austin, is a facility that is outgrowing its space. The main concerns expressed by the faculty include limited storage, vehicle circulation issues, limited meeting rooms, and limited workroom spaces.

The CAC reported additional needs as follows: More parking, covered sidewalks for drop off and pick up, additional storage, better ventilation, shade for both playgrounds, additional space for special needs students, relief of flooding in the portable areas, and a better track.

#### **Survey Overview**

Survey results give an unsatisfactory rating to the art rooms, library, administration offices, and playground spaces. There is a desire for an assembly space for the campus, a larger library space, hands-on project spaces, storage, and a community engagement facility. The responses express satisfaction with the physical condition of the overall facility and the public areas, but dissatisfaction with the condition of the outdoor areas and the outdoor sports facilities. The facility is reported to not support project-based learning or maker spaces, despite the desire for these types of instruction. Faculty meeting space is reported as very limited. Furniture and classroom flexibility are reported as unsatisfactory. Responses expressed a desire for more security cameras and bringing all classrooms into a building rather than in the portables.

#### Interview Overview

The interview at Hart Elementary school was attended by the principal and two instructors on the campus. The feedback pinpointed the biggest campus priorities as increased storage, improved site circulation and perimeter security, and additional dedicated meeting and work rooms. The storage in the annex building is sufficient, while the original building is reported to have very little storage in the classrooms. The portables on campus are housing some art and music classes which is unsatisfactory for these spaces and the storage needed. Vehicle circulation is an issue at dismissal. Students do not have a fence to block them from traveling alongside the vehicles and some pedestrians are crossing in front of the path of traffic. The cafeteria and gym are undersized for the student population at the campus, and the stage needs updated audio and visual equipment. The exterior playscape is undersized for the number of students and has inadequate shade. Additionally, work rooms and office spaces are very limited. The current ARD conference room shares space with the supply room, which creates issues when in use.

The programs desired at the campus include outdoor learning areas with shade, convenient drinking water access for these spaces, and adequate playscapes for all ages of their students. They also expressed interest in a fine arts wing, more meeting and office space, and dedicated spaces for

specialists for each grade.

The safety concerns on the campus include the limited camera surveillance, limited site lighting, and the lack of a secure, fenced perimeter around the school grounds. The lack of the fenced area enables students to be walking directly by the higher traffic areas during parent pick-up at the campus. Pests are also a reported issue, especially termites in the walls as well as roaches and ants. The administration would also like a secure vestibule for their campus to help limit visitors from passing the office.

The faculty believe that future education will demand technology-driven infrastructure in school and there will be a focus on flexible spaces. They also predict that there will be multiple workspaces for students and teachers such as pods for collaborations. At the conclusion of the meeting, the highest priories expressed were increased storage, improved site circulation for vehicles and students, and increased meeting and workroom spaces.

#### **Assessment Findings**

The Educational Suitability Assessment of Hart Elementary School earned a 63% overall score and places the campus in a category of average. The assessment consists of 11 categories to determine areas that need more attention.

#### Lower Scoring Categories: Average Categories

#### **Exterior**

Score is average.

The traffic circulation at the school is a problem during pick-up and drop-off. The cars get extremely backed up and there are pedestrians trying to cross through the flow of traffic to access the school. Additionally the students that walk home exit the building right along the parent pick-up area and there is no separation to help teachers keep these kids away from the vehicular traffic. There are some opportunities for outdoor learning, but they need to be developed and shaded. The playground space is inadequate in terms of equipment and there is not shade for this area. The track is in poor shape.

#### **Future Ready Student Development**

Score is average.

The facility is limited for project-based learning, and there are common "pod" spaces in some areas, but they are being used as teacher workroom and assembly space. The lack of teacher work rooms is limiting instructional space, and the meeting rooms in the building are lacking as well. The storage space is also inadequate to support project-based learning. Classrooms have projection and whiteboards for the most part.

#### **Academic & Co-Curricular Support**

Score is average.

The pre-K and kindergarten classrooms are average in size and configuration. The gymnasium is inadequate in size, but there is an additional outdoor gymnasium space that is shaded. There are restrooms located off of the gym area and storage spaces for indoor and outdoor athletic

areas. The stage is in okay condition and features wheelchair access. While the building's art and music rooms are a nice size with moderate storage space, there are art and music classes in the portables which is inadequate for both classroom space and support for these programs. This creates inequitable access to equipment for students in art, because the kiln is located far from the portable spaces. The computer lab spaces are average but there is a need for additional charging spaces to support the devices. Special education and resource spaces need more specialized equipment and support space per the educational specification. The cafeteria is undersized for the overcrowded campus.

#### **Storage**

Score is average.

The general building storage is inadequate. Some classrooms are equipped with only minimal built-in cabinets while others have larger storage capacity in fairly good condition. The new annex classrooms have dedicated storage closets and cabinets. The student storage is accommodated by hooks and furniture which is average.

#### **Environmental Quality**

Score is good.

The quality of the artificial lighting is appropriate for classroom functions, and there is ample natural light and access to exterior views in the learning spaces. The acoustics are poor between classrooms and the building has reported termites and some odors in the restrooms.

#### **Technology**

Score is good.

The administration reports that the campus has received some new technology devices for students, however, they need more portable charging stations to support these devices. The access to plugs in the classroom is average. The facilities have some projection capabilities, but there is a mix of new and old devices.

#### Security

Score is average.

The facility has key card access at the main entries. There is an issue of access for students between the main building and the annex. They must always borrow a keycard to get back into the building which instructors report is inconvenient. The location of the central office is at the front of the building, but it does not create a secure vestibule for visitors to the school. The interior transparency is good for faculty supervision, but the camera surveillance and site lighting on the campus is lacking.

#### **Higher Scoring Categories:** Good Categories

#### Furniture, Fixtures & Equipment

Score is good.

The furniture is not new, but it is in fair condition and generally is flexible for reconfiguration of the learning spaces.

Score is good.

The classrooms have individual thermal controls and effective blinds for controlling natural light. The artificial lighting controls vary in the spaces. They are mainly two switches for alternating row control.

#### Library/Media Center

Score is good.

The library has limited space but features several tables and chairs conducive for small and large group collaborations. The condition of the library is good, and there is a learning stair and some casual seating for social interaction. Due to its configuration the areas for quiet study are limited, and the faculty reported they are outgrowing this space. There is a small area for technological support.

#### **General Building**

Score is good.

The access for community functions and the general appearance of the school including the main entry are nice attributes. The gym and cafeteria area can be accessed from the main entry and the library space has its own exterior entry. The campus has an overall good appearance, especially in the newer annex wing.




