



Educational Suitability Summary Report

Pleasant Hill Elementary School

Date: 07/26/2016 Score 63% Average

Pleasant Hill Elementary School, serving a student population of approximately 560 students in south Austin, is a Pre-K through 5th grade school. This campus has ten portables. The most important issues for this campus are improving the safety and security concerns, upgrading the playground spaces, and upgrading and increasing the technology in the classrooms.

Survey Overview

Survey results from the principal, Kristi Cisneros, report that she is "very unsatisfied" with the educational suitability of the playgrounds including their physical condition and security, and she is "unsatisfied" with the library, furniture, common spaces, and the general condition of the building overall. The spaces desired on the campus include small group learning spaces and a computer lab. The only spaces that were reported as "satisfactory" are the art rooms. The small group meeting spaces and collaboration spaces are reported as unsatisfactory and limited in space. Technological improvements in the form of touch screens and innovation stations are desired.

The safety and security issues include limited site lighting, video surveillance and the inability to access the security footage effectively. The playground areas are also reported to be uneven and infested with ants. The uneven ground and concrete edges of the play areas are causing student injuries. The interior environment is reported as unsatisfactory in regards to indoor air quality and the temperature controls. The responses also include the need for more parking and better signage. She would like the campus to have mentor space and public access to the play fields in order to increase community participation at the school. She does believe this campus is considered a community landmark.

Interview Overview

The interview conducted at Pleasant Hill Elementary School was attended by the principal Kristi Cisneros. She expressed that the common areas currently are not being used to their full potential because they lack the necessary moveable partitions, furniture, and technology. The general storage is also poor through the campuses, and there are no secure storage areas. The stage area is reportedly serving as a storage area. There is also a reported lack of pin-up and whiteboards in classrooms. The playground spaces are causing student injuries due to the uneven grounds and outdated equipment. The technology needs to be increased on the campus as well. Currently only about one out of three classrooms have projector or innovation stations. There is not adequate area for teacher collaborations or large meetings. The signage and wayfinding in the building is also a concern. The furniture is outdated and the lighting is poor. The faculty parking is limited.

She expressed the desire for a dedicated computer lab in the building rather than the current configuration that has computers in one corner of the library. She would also like to have more

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dedicated spaces for after-school programs such as an enrichment room. She also expressed interest in creating educational murals throughout the hallways.

The safety concerns on the campus include the limited video surveillance and inability for the cameras to change their view angles. The operating system for this footage is consistently malfunctioning and the coverage does not capture many areas on the campus. The exterior lighting is also a critical concern, especially at the back of the building. The many exterior doors to the building create concerns for the administration because many of them are not closing properly. There is a need for an appropriate sidewalk for bus riders to use.

The principal expressed that the garden space by the library is important to maintain. When thinking of the future of education, the principal expressed that the students' classroom setting will transition to wireless outdoor classrooms with a heavy focus on technology.

The most important issues for Pleasant Hill Elementary are improving the safety and security issues, upgrading the playground spaces, and upgrading the instructional technology in the classrooms.

Assessment Findings

The Educational Suitability Assessment of Pleasant Hill Elementary earned a 63% overall score and places the campus in a category of "average". The assessment consists of 11 categories to determine areas that need more attention.

Lower Scoring Categories: Unsatisfactory Categories

Furniture, Fixtures & Equipment

The score is unsatisfactory.

The campus has outdated furniture. Most of the furniture is large and inflexible for different configurations and group sizes. Some desks observed were broken or damaged.

Technology

The score is unsatisfactory.

There is a mix of older and newer technology in the form of some older projectors and some newer computers for classroom use. There are still chalkboards in some classroom spaces, and there is only about one innovation station for every three classroom spaces. There is an adequate number of power outlets and data ports in learning spaces.

Higher Scoring Categories: Average and Good Categories

Exterior

The score is good.

The vehicular circulation is separated effectively, but the stack space is limited. There are some outdoor learning spaces that need some additional development in the form of updated furniture and equipment. The playground equipment is outdated and the uneven ground is causing student injuries. These areas need additional equipment, shade, and improved ground cover.

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The building has limited signage that needs improving.

Storage

The score is average.

The general building storage is almost non-existent. The classrooms feature tall built-in cabinets that are somewhat dated but are functioning well in most spaces. The locks in some of the classrooms' cabinets need replacing for more secure storage options. Student storage is accommodated by wall hooks that are throughout the campus.

Future Ready Student Development

The score is average.

The campus classrooms are adequate in size to accommodate hands-on project-based learning, but the classroom support space is limited for these types of projects. The campus meeting space is limited, but the common "pod" areas allow for group collaborations of different sizes. The facility lacks consistent visual communication tools across classrooms. There are some projectors but most of this technology is quite outdated. The classrooms with chalkboards need visual communication tool upgrades.

Controllability of Systems

The score is average.

The classrooms have functional thermal controls but there is inadequate artificial lighting control in the form of only alternating row lighting control. The classrooms have blinds for controlling natural light, but they are in poor condition.

Security

The score is good.

The location of the central office does not create a secure vestibule for the campus; however, it is located at the front entry for supervision of those entering the school. Key card access is at some of the major entries, but not all. The interior transparency is good for faculty supervision within the school. Site lighting and video surveillance around the campus is limited and needs upgrades, especially due to the multiple exterior doors to the school that need coverage.

Academic & Co-Curricular Support

The score is good.

The Pre-K and kindergarten areas are appropriately configured, but the restrooms are somewhat small. Athletic spaces are good and the support spaces are well-sized. The music classroom is small, but the stage area is in good condition. The art room is an adequate size and features appropriate equipment and support space. The special education spaces are being taught in portables, which is unsatisfactory for classroom spaces as well as support. The cafeteria is a moderate size, and a wheelchair lift is being added to provide equal access to the stage.

General Building

The score is good.

The configuration of the cafeteria and gymnasium allows these spaces to be secured from the

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rest of the classroom spaces for community events. However, the library is less accessible for community events, and cannot be secured from the other classroom spaces. The hallways are moderately wide, and the general school appearance is aged but sufficient.

Environmental Quality

The score is good.

The quality of the artificial lighting is appropriate for classroom functions, and all of the classroom spaces have natural light. However, there are a few spaces with window placements that do not allow for sufficient exterior views. There are reported issues with ants, mice, roaches, and spiders. The acoustics are average.

Library/Media Center

The score is excellent.

The library has space for collaborative work of different group sizes. There is a need for upgraded furniture to better accommodate flexibility. The library has appropriate space for quiet study and a large area for accessing technology. The administration expressed a desire for these devices to be in a separate, dedicated computer lab.

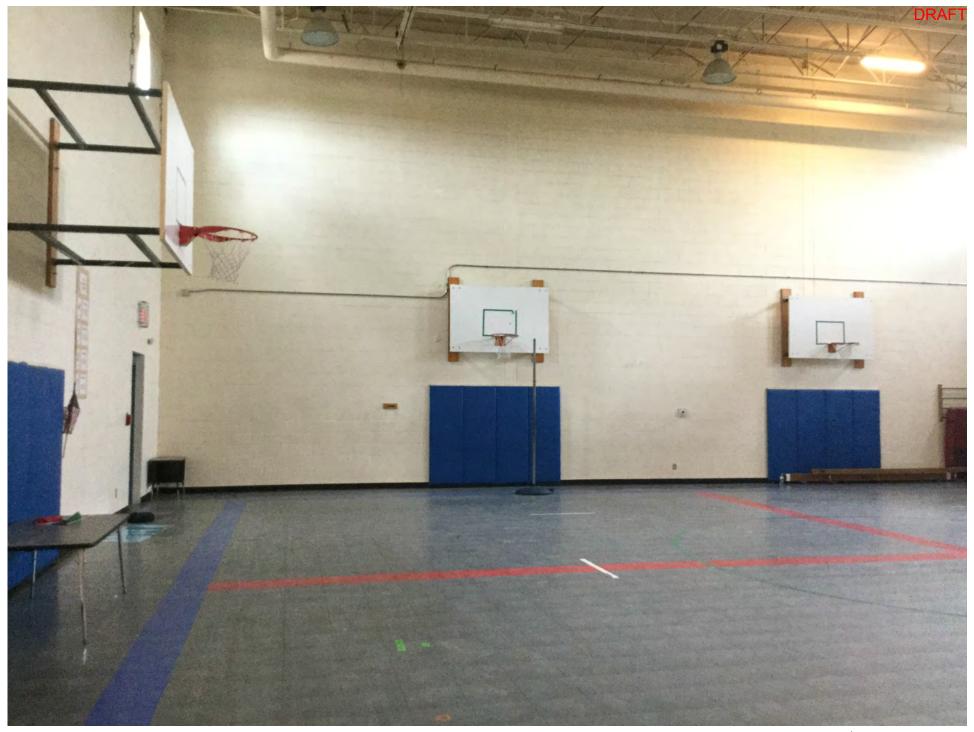
