Bedichek Middle School is serving a student population of approximately 900 students in South Austin. After interviewing the Principal, staff and the CAC for science, as well as conducting a campus walk assessment, the facility exhibits an overall average condition for educational suitability. Deficiencies found were primarily focused on the inconsistent science classrooms, lack of adequate technology and equipment for staff in the classrooms, including printers and scanners, science room updates, campus storage, updates to furniture, adequate space for dance studio and entire 6th grade basic classrooms, pest issues and campus accessibility. The campus would like to add a kick start/karate and medical program and become a medical magnet school and needs suitable spaces to accommodate the associated needs with appropriate equipment.

Survey Overview

No survey results have been received at this time.

Interview Overview

From the interview with the principal, the main spaces thought to not be suitable were the portables. Among the programs in portables least suitable were dance and choir. Currently, there are 11 portables for 6th grade basic classrooms. Recent renovations were made for the administrative offices and a maker space is under construction in the library. With the renovations, temporary partitions were installed for staff offices, but the offices are only temporary and will need to find other spaces to serve as offices for at-risk counselors. The life skills is new but needs some additional storage. Currently, the life skills restroom is being used as a storage space.

The science rooms are inconsistent with layout and furniture. Some need reconfiguring of cabinets for wall display and in some classrooms the projectors do not function. The projection screen location divides part of the room. Some of the rooms have fixed tables while others have loose tables and chairs. Some science classrooms were functioning as ELA and SBS classrooms. Furniture in typical classrooms is dated and worn and does have flexibility. The configuration of the choir room in the building is not ADA accessible, with the only access by stairs. The campus also lacks adequate storage. The bookroom is insufficient and often has pallets of books sitting outside the dedicated storage room. The wood shop has building materials stored in an office space and the band hall has current roof leak issues as well as a lack of storage with practice rooms being used as storage when not in use. Psychologist and speech pathologist are in a small shared space that was a storage area for the science classrooms.

The principal has expressed some safety concerns on the campus with temporary walls at the 100 wing not being stable. In various locations there are broken handrails at various locations. Overall, the campus needs added and improved lighting and the ant and rodent issues need to be addressed. There is a concern for students' safety crossing a very busy intersection at South 1st Street and William Cannon.

If any major renovations occur on campus, measures should be taken to preserve or salvage the murals on campus including ones painted on the exterior of the portables and the central courtyard space.

Future thinking for the campus to consider involves a focus on having sufficient power and data connectivity for devices in the classrooms with an infrastructure that supports their needs with consistent technology. The campus desires current technology for every student and smart walls to allow for more flexibility in the typical classrooms. There is a desire for all science programs in the district to have advanced instructional technology screens, such as a giant iPad type technology that has the touchscreen capability. The campus currently has Project Lead the Way and would like more engineering programs. Some programs the campus would like to add are a kick start/karate and medical program, and to possibly become a medical magnet school. Both programs would need appropriate spaces to include these programs.

The most critical issues for the campus is the lack of current and functioning technology for the teachers in the classrooms. In addition to visual tools of a functioning computer and projector, the equipment most needed are dedicated printers for staff that print confidential documents, including color printers, and benchmark scanners of which most are at end of life. For science classrooms there is high interest in updated display technology with a touch screen type. Secure cabinets in the vault are needed as well. The dance studio needs an adequate space rather than a portable. The school would like to eliminate the portables. The campus also has issues overall with storage and has a need to address the rodent and ant problems.

Assessment Findings

The Educational Suitability Assessment of Bedichek Middle School earned a 55% overall score and places the campus in a category of average. The assessment consists of 11 categories to determine areas that need more attention.

Lower Scoring Categories:

Technology

The score is unsatisfactory.

The facility has outdated devices. Technology needs upgrades throughout the campus. Some technology in classrooms are not fully functioning and connectivity is not in convenient locations.

Storage

The score is unsatisfactory.

The general building storage is limited, and the book room is undersized. Books have been left outside on pallets and storage on loading dock area. A number of storage containers were observed near playfields, and wood shop material stored in an office space. There is furniture being stored on stage in the cafeteria. The lockers for students are not being used to minimize unfavorable social distractions during transitions. There are minimal cabinets in typical classrooms. The storage room in the science wing was converted to a shared office space for the psychologist and speech therapist. Band hall practice rooms are used for storage when not in use.

Furniture, Fixtures & Equipment

The score is unsatisfactory.

The furniture is old and in worn condition, scratched and marked. Classrooms have a mix of furniture that can and cannot reconfigure easily. Science classrooms have laminate countertops with sinks and dated lab tables that are fixed to the floor.

Exterior

The score is average.

Buses, cars and pedestrian traffic occur in the same location but few buses arrive at the school. The courtyard is a nice outdoor learning spaces, but they need upgrades with outdoor furniture and landscape maintenance to function appropriately. The playgrounds and track are in good shape. The signage is faded and not clearly visible. There is a small sign posted on the front doors to indicate where visitors should enter.

Future Ready Student Development

The score is average.

The campus has limited dedicated wood shop and robotics rooms with equipment and furniture for hands-on project based learning, but more storage is needed. Typical classroom storage is insufficient and undersized for hands-on project based learning. Maker space is currently under construction in the Library. More breakout spaces are needed for one on one and collaborative teaching. There is a lack of meeting and conference rooms, areas for informal interaction, and areas for students to work independently. The classrooms that have projectors and screens are dated, functioning poorly or not functioning at all. There are several exterior spaces for social interaction by the stairs, ramps and courtyard.

Environmental Quality

The score is average.

The classrooms allow some sound transfer between rooms. The narrow windows in the classrooms allow little natural light into the spaces and are too small to allow much of a view outside in most cases. The campus has a rodent and ant problem throughout the school. One science classroom had a scent machine plugged in to get rid of the rat odor.

Controllability of Systems

The score is average.

The classrooms have individual thermal controls and blinds for controlling natural light. However, the artificial lighting controls are limited to one switch.

Library/Media Center

The score is average.

The library is not near the main entry and requires entering the main building to gain access. There is some space that supports quiet study and is flexible for collaborative work of different group sizes. The general appearance is good with new and flexible furniture. Currently undergoing renovations to include a maker space.

General Building

The score is average.

Circulation routes are wide enough to safely and effectively accommodate student movement with primary corridors at about 8 feet wide. Only exterior walkways are 10 feet more than in width. The ramps are narrow for multiple users at once. Two of the community use areas (gym and cafeteria) are arranged without full school access. The overall building is aged but well maintained. Painted mural on the front portable is a well-liked feature as well as interior murals, with most of the building front obscured by parked cars and large trees.

Academic & Co-Curricular Support

The score is average.

Classrooms are small and support spaces such as classroom and student storage are insufficient. Science classrooms are inconsistent with only a few that are adequate with appropriate furniture and support spaces. The science storage room is now used as shared office space. The gym area is in good shape in general. Band hall has only one practice room directly attached. The practice rooms are in the orchestra room. The condition of the stage floor is old and worn. The practice stage area is now converted into a wall storage unit. Life skills are in a new space in very good condition. It was stated that there was need for additional storage for life skills.

Higher Scoring Categories:

Security

The score is good.

There is a secure vestibule to the campus and most exterior doors have key card access. Better lighting is needed, and hand rails at various locations need to be repaired. Interior transparency is average to supervise students not in classrooms with a mix of doors that have narrow windows and some with larger windows.




