

Are schools closed?

Even though campuses are closed, learning will continue. Starting April 6, the district will be categorized as: "Closed, Instructing: Those who cease normal operations, so that children no longer come to the school site at all, but are instead provided support to receive instruction at home." Following the Governor's order issued on March 31, Austin ISD campuses will be closed through May 4.

What if a student is enrolled in Advanced Coursework?**Advanced Placement Exams**

Exams will all be taken at home in the form of free-response essays or short-answer questions. The College Board is providing free video review lessons for students. Teachers will also support students by providing online instruction.

Early College High School/Dual Credit

At this time, ACC plans to resume classes March 30. All courses will be administered online. All students who are in dual credit courses will be contacted to ensure they have the technology they need to continue their work.

International Baccalaureate

The May examination sessions are canceled. Students will be awarded a diploma or a course certificate based on each student's coursework. More information and guidance is forthcoming.

UT OnRamps

The courses will restart April 6. UT has adjusted the curriculum so students will be able to complete the coursework by the end of the semester. Our teachers will continue to support our students online. College credit will still be available for students.

What about college exams?

ACT—The April examination has been canceled. The next scheduled exam is June 13.

SAT—The March and May examinations have been canceled. The June 6 exam is still scheduled. Khan Academy will be available for all students to prepare for the examination.

TSI—The examination must be taken in a certified testing site, but there is an option for students to take the test at home. The High School Office is investigating whether the option is viable for AISD students.

What about prom and graduation?

In response to the Stay Home – Work Safe order, which bans all large gatherings, all proms scheduled through May 1 have been canceled. Proms that are scheduled after May 1 may also be canceled. The High Schools Office is monitoring city updates to determine whether to cancel all proms.

AISD's graduation ceremonies may also be canceled. The High School Office is in discussions with UT to possibly identify new dates if the May graduations cannot take place. More information will be provided as available.
