PROCEEDINGS

Preliminaries

- The meeting was called to order by Dr. Jane Ross at 4:31 p.m. in the Board Auditorium of the Carruth Administration Center.
- There were no citizen communications.
- Dr. Ross introduced several new members.
- Dr. Ross announced the formation of a new DAC subcommittee focusing on PK-2 supports, and asked for volunteers.
- There were no items from members.
- The two candidates for non-staff co-chair, Andy Anderson and Genevieve Dell, provided brief statements. Joey Crumley distributed ballots for the co-chair election. Mr. Crumley explained that an Executive Committee election was not necessary, according to DAC bylaws, since there were only enough candidates who announced before the filing deadline to fill the seats available.

Superintendent's Update

- Dr. Cruz provided the following updates:
 - Video on first day of school activities.
 - New academic programs.
 - Graduation rate at an all-time high.
- Discussion points included:
 - Sunshades are needed for playgrounds/
 - Priorities for this year are literacy, the bond, and customer service.
 - Crockett needs more than what's currently being proposed in the bond.
 - The bond is only covering \$1 billion of the \$4 billion identified by the FABPAC we're having to address the worst first at this time, and a higher bond price would mean raising taxes.
 - Customer service is monitored through surveys and conversations with stakeholders.
 - Customer service staff needs to be increased.
 - Bond money can only be used for capital projects.
 - The district is still looking at dual language options.
 - Leveling may involve teachers moving to other campuses.
 - Authentic literature definitely helps literacy.
 - Literacy is going to require multiple strategies.
 - A lot of kids need books at home, and the Book Bus is helping to do that; kids need to be able to read to their passions and interests.
 - HR has been doing a good job in all of the leveling efforts.

Title I Equity Plan

- Dr. Mary Thomas, Director of State and Federal Accountability, presented the following:
 - There are limitations on what Title I funding can be used for, but we may be able to find other resources locally.
 - Some Title I funding will be going away, so we'll need to be more creative.
 - As a district, we're also losing Title I money as a result of fewer students being enrolled.
 - Through TEA, districts are now required to develop a plan to identify and address any disparities that result in low-income students and minority students being taught at higher rates than other students by ineffective, inexperienced, or out-of-field teachers.
 - The plan is in draft form now, and will go to the Board for approval in November.
- Discussion points included:
 - We're looking at the experience of principals as well as teachers.
 - We're also looking at various ways to collect information.
 - There are exit conferences with teachers, and we're working to improve how data is captured at the campus level.
 - We're working to get input from various stakeholder groups.
 - Another root cause should be affordable housing for teachers in Austin, as well as the taxes.

Accountability Update

- Carolyn Hanschen, Director of Campus and District Accountability, presented the following:
 - Latest campus ratings.
 - STAAR performance level descriptions.
 - Implementation of HB 22 (A-F rating system).
 - In August 2018, districts and campuses will receive A-F ratings for each of three domains and an overall grade.
 - There are measures for school progress, relative performance, and closing gaps.
 - Districts are now able to add locally developed accountability ratings.
- Discussion points included:
 - There will be no percentile targets.
 - Other targets will be determined before data is actually seen.
 - There doesn't seem to be a way to account for high schools applying rigor in instruction.
 - IR schools fall into a special intervention system.
 - Exemption from final exams isn't part of state accountability, and the Teaching and Learning office will need to be consulted on that.

Other Business

- Mr. Crumley announced that Andy Anderson had been elected to serve another term as non-staff cochair.
- Mr. Crumley also reminded members about the upcoming annual DAC retreat, on October 17 at the Performing Arts Center.
