**PROCEEDINGS**

**Preliminaries**

- The meeting was called to order by Dr. Jane Ross at 9:00 a.m. in the Multipurpose Room of the Performing Arts Center.
- The members participated in an icebreaker.

**District of Innovation Update**

- The presentations of Rachel Naugle, Administrative Supervisor in Teaching and Learning, and Michelle Treviño, PEIMS Coordinator in Accountability and Assessment, included the following points:
  - ☞ Overview of Districts of Innovation (DOI)
  - ☞ Components of AISD's DOI plan
  - ☞ AISD campuses that currently participate in DOI options
  - ☞ How to find out student days off by campus
  - ☞ Next steps in the process
- Discussion points included:
  - ☞ In addition to the AISD homepage, information can be found on campus websites
  - ☞ The district will be monitoring effectiveness of professional development activities
  - ☞ We can modify the plan during its 5-year span
  - ☞ Individual campuses can opt out of vertical team approaches
  - ☞ Even though certain school days may be adjusted, students are still required to have a minimum amount of instructional minutes per year
  - ☞ This is the first year of this process, so there have been some bumps in the road, but in the future campuses will need to turn in their plans earlier so that school communities have more advance notice of adjusted school days

- ☞ Some of the proposed district calendars for the next school year would end the school year before Memorial Day – parents and teachers will get to vote on their calendar preference
- ☞ It would be good to require every CAC to have an opportunity to discuss options that are available
- ☞ It would also be helpful for CACs to see what other campuses and vertical teams are doing
- ☞ CACs don't usually involve input from a lot of people – a CAC may not represent the majority opinion of a school community

### **Campus Cohorts and Testing**

- The presentation of Kathy Ryan, Director of Academics, including the following points:
  - ☞ District-wide assessment schedules for the elementary and secondary levels
  - ☞ System of cohorts for supporting campuses
  - ☞ Details of the Cohort 1 support model
  - ☞ Monitoring of Cohort 1 campuses
- Discussion points included:
  - ☞ Monitoring documentation is handled by support staff – campuses don't have to do it
  - ☞ Fidelity to bilingual programs is not always being followed
  - ☞ The support teams seem to have a limited lens when it comes to fixing things
  - ☞ A lot of younger kids are testing on computers now, and there is some concern that they may not be as computer proficient as older kids
  - ☞ Schools need better computers in order to use new products more effectively
  - ☞ There needs to be more assurance that monitoring results are being trickled down

### **Financial Update**

- The presentation of Nicole Conley, Chief Financial Officer, included the following points:
  - ☞ The state's basic responsibility in public education
  - ☞ Historical and projected Chapter 41 recapture payments by AISD
  - ☞ The state's growing dependence on local property taxes to fund public education
  - ☞ Outcomes of the last state legislative session
  - ☞ Possible impacts of Houston area districts not having to pay recapture this year due to Hurricane Harvey
  - ☞ Other factors contributing to financial pressure on AISD
  - ☞ Program evaluation as a part of budgeting decisions
- Discussion points included:
  - ☞ Our total annual budget is so high because it includes what we have to pay in recapture – our actual operating costs are much less than the total
  - ☞ I&S tax collections are not subject to recapture
  - ☞ Bond dollars can't be used to cover operating costs – they can only be used for capital projects
  - ☞ There is a state required minimum property tax rate of one dollar for school districts
  - ☞ The proposed "tax swap" with the City of Austin has hit some snags, but hasn't been totally taken off the table
  - ☞ We will work to put a tax calculator on the district website so that people can see where there taxes are actually going
  - ☞ We pay more to the state in recapture than we get back through formula funding
  - ☞ We've maintained a relatively large budget for special education – despite the cost, we allow in transfers of special education students while many districts do not
  - ☞ The upcoming March primaries will be important if we hope to keep attention on school finance reform

## Superintendent's Update

- The update of Dr. Cruz included the following points:
  - ☞ A thanks to DAC members for their continuing commitment
  - ☞ AISD's all-time high graduation rate of 90.7% is among the top in the nation
  - ☞ AISD students continue to outperform their national and state peers in SAT and ACT performance
  - ☞ Our single bond proposition of over \$1 billion will come before voters on November 7
  - ☞ Equity is an important consideration throughout our Facility Master Plan
  - ☞ Our annual student, parent, and staff surveys show some very positive results
  - ☞ The new Early College High Schools at Lanier and Eastside Memorial are underway
- Discussion points included:
  - ☞ We coordinate closely with the Greater Austin Chamber of Commerce, City of Austin, and Travis County to look at local and regional job market trends so that we can better prepare our graduates
  - ☞ The emphasis on SEL has been very positive
  - ☞ At every one of last year's high school graduations, there was a voter registration booth – also, recent messages have been sent out to principals to encourage students to register and to vote
  - ☞ When you put in the effort, along with the resources, special needs students really show their true talents
  - ☞ SEL and literacy are both core to our work
  - ☞ Students drop out when they don't have a connection to their school
  - ☞ If a district refuses to pay recapture, the state can take punitive actions, including seizure of property
  - ☞ There are movements around the state to push for more support for education, and to elect more moderate Republican legislators

## SEL 2.0 Update

- The presentation of Pete Price, Director of SEL and Multi-Tiered Systems of Supports, included the following points:
  - ☞ We're using SEL to promote positive relationships and quality customer service
  - ☞ SEL enforces the "6 Power Skills" (collaboration, communication, connection, creativity, critical thinking, and cultural responsiveness)
  - ☞ SEL strives to provide learning environments that are safe, inclusive, culturally aware, academically engaging, and equitable
  - ☞ SEL strongly supports the district's Theory of Change
  - ☞ The 3 signature practices of SEL are welcoming routines and rituals, engaging pedagogy, and optimistic closure
- Discussion points included:
  - ☞ We need more SEL materials in other languages
  - ☞ Our SEL program is so extensive and nationally recognized largely in part to very significant donations from the community
  - ☞ A lot of parents don't understand SEL, which is why the buy-in isn't always there
  - ☞ Better integrating SEL into interventions and discipline would help both teachers and parents
  - ☞ We need to hire for SEL competencies
  - ☞ The AISD cloud includes a direct SEL connection
