The below updates are from AISD staff and departments that are contributing to AISD's sustainability efforts.



Sustainability (Update from Darien Clary & Carsen Daniel)

- AISD Sustainability has partnered with the City of Austin's Office of Climate Action and Resilience and Keep Austin Beautiful for this year's CoA <u>Food Waste Innovation Grant</u> "Zero Waste Heroes" to reduce food waste in three of our schools: Overton Elementary, General Marshall Middle School, and Eastside Early College High School.
- This summer, AISD Sustainability & AISD Warehouse connected with Harvest Lumber to <u>salvage wood materials</u> from the Anita Ferrales Coy Facility in East Austin, which is undergoing a full demolition to make way for affordable housing.
- Austin ISD Sustainability and Outdoor Learning are partnering with <u>National Wildlife Federation EcoSchools US</u> for the first AISD Green Team Leaders Collaborative, offering grant-funded stipends to 20 educators across 14 campuses to launch green teams at their school, get eco-certified, and attend professional development workshops throughout the year.

- US Green Building Council's Texas chapter hosted a <u>Green Building</u> tour at Eastside Early College High School on Tuesday 9/23 to celebrate Eastside's recently awarded <u>AIA National Education Facility</u> <u>Design award</u> for its design that intentionally connects a marginalized community, acknowledging its past, supporting its present, and offering opportunities for its future.

Energy & Water (Update from Rey Torres, Louis Zachary, Darien Clary, & Carsen Daniel)

- Rey has engaged with Holt Renewables, which installed several AISD solar projects in 2017. They have repaired the photovoltaic system at Navarro HS and will also repair the system at Paredes MS.
- Learn more about renewable energy at AISD.
- Rey is working on getting the AISD Utility Dashboard updated for public view.
- We are installing power meters at schools which enable AISD to remotely monitor power status in real-time, which is important during bad weather and disaster response. They also enable us to verify load reduction during load curtailment requests from Austin Energy. AISD aims to have power meters in all schools. Currently, 40 schools have power meters. All 2017 and 2022 bond schools include power meters.





Transportation (Update from Rica Sunga-Kwan, Kris Hafezizadeh, Miguel Rios)

• The Electric Bus Master Plan has been completed and will be shared with the board this winter.



Sustainable Food (Update from Diane Grodek & Lindsey Bradley)

- We kicked off the school year introducing some new plant-based dishes, Korean Rebellyous Kickin' Tenders with Ramen at secondaries, and Falafel with Pita Bread at elementary schools. We received positive feedback on the falafel, with some campuses sharing how students were excited to have a taste of home served at school.
- We will celebrate National School Lunch Week, October 14-17! The theme this year is Taste the World: Your School Lunch Passport. Our menus will feature global inspired recipes from Peru (Peruvian Chicken Drumstick and Quinoa Chaufa), Italy (Penne and Sauce), India (Chana Masala), and El Salvador (Pupusas, Curtido and Plantains).
- October is also Farm to School Month and we will join districts across
 the state in participating in Texas Department of Agriculture's Farm
 Fresh Challenge! We will be highlighting local vendors throughout the
 month, as well as featuring Apples from Idalou, TX, Sweet Potatoes
 from Fredericksburg, TX, and Watermelon from Edinburg, TX.
- During the week of October 27th, we will roll out our new Fall Harvest Salad! It has local apples and roasted sweet potatoes, alongside lettuce, dried cherries, chicken or chickpeas and a scratchmade honey mustard dressing!
- The Food Service Department has a goal of reducing single-use, disposable items by \$250,000 for this school year!
 - Our teams have been working on small tweaks in the kitchens to achieve this goal including setting up fewer trash and compost cans per kitchen (to save on bags) and offering more self -serve options than we ever have before!



Warehouse (Update from Mark Curtis)

- The warehouse team has recycled 46,000 pounds of mixed metal since the start of the school year.
- <u>Battery recycling buckets</u> have been distributed to all AISD campus and facility locations.





Nature & Outdoor Learning (Update from Colleen Garland, Mandi Golman, & Joanna Orozco)

- Outdoor Learning has made their website live. Check it out <u>here!</u>
- Through grant funding, we have finished assembling 167 Outdoor Learning wagons and have distributed 2 carts to all 82 elementary schools and to 3 middle schools in the district!



- We also are providing the <u>Easy PEASy Guidebook</u> to every elementary school as well as their <u>TEKS aligned lessons online</u> (Teachers: for login info, contact OWL@austinisd.org or ask your campus librarian).
- You are invited! The <u>Outdoor Wonder and Learning Center</u> ribbon cutting will be <u>September 26th at 10:00 am</u> and will host its first field trip for Sanchez Elementary. Join us! Read the recent feature in the Austin Chronicle <u>here</u>.
- We hosted a clean up of the Metz courtyard with the help of AISD volunteer staff. Zilker Botanical Gardens donated fairy materials from their <u>Woodland Faerie Trail</u> and we were able to reuse them in the courtyard. Austin Watershed hosted their first Earth Camp 9/17 and enjoyed the renovated space.
- OWL and Office of Sustainability will be launching new efforts to proliferate Green Teams and help all AISD campuses register to be an <u>EcoSchool</u> through the <u>National Wildlife Federation</u>.



Urban Forestry (Update from Sydnie Levell)

- Summer work with TxCC is completed! They will return in fall for a few weeks and next summer to continue to provide care to campus trees. Crews cared for over 700 trees at four AISD facilities and sixteen campuses last season.
- Multiple crew members are now interested in Urban Forestry career pathways with one member already approved to sit for the International Society of Arboriculture (ISA) Certified Arborist exam.
- Sydnie will be attending the ISA Texas Chapter Conference the last week of September.
