
Sustainability, Energy, & Environment (Update from Darien Clary & Carsen Daniel)

- Our Sustainability Department has a new name: Sustainability, Energy, and Environment. The scope now includes sustainability, environmental quality & compliance, grounds & schoolyards, and energy and water conservation. See our new org chart.
- Host an intern this summer to support green career pathways.
 By <u>registering</u>, business partners can cultivate a talent pipeline, engage with students and educators, increase company exposure in the community, and mentor our future workforce.
- Eastside Early College High School won the <u>Austin Green Award</u> for sustainable design. The campus, designed by <u>Perkins&Will</u>, was recognized for its design to positively influence what Austin's future will be- addressing the urgent environmental, health and social challenges of today and tomorrow. Darien Clary, Director of Sustainability, Energy, & Environment, was the event's <u>keynote speaker</u>.

Energy & Water (Update from Reynaldo Torres, Louis Zachary, Darien Clary, & Carsen Daniel)

- Utility Dashboard. Reynaldo Torres, Energy & Water Manager, is updating the dashboard with the past 5 years of data. This was paused during the pandemic, and we will be excited to relaunch the dashboard. Schools can still request current data from reynaldo.h.torres@austinisd.org or generate reports online.
- Solar Summit. In partnership with <u>EcoRise</u>, <u>Austin Energy</u>, and <u>Axis Solar</u>. We are coordinating a field trip for 4th graders at two schools that are included in our Department of Energy solar grant. Students will visit the <u>Austin Energy La Loma Community</u> Solar Farm and The Thinkery.
- **Demand Response**. As of November, the <u>Demand Response</u> earnings from Austin Energy are \$260K for this year. This program pays utility users to conserve energy during peak use.



Transportation (Update from Kris Hafezizadeh & Miguel Rios)

 Air Conditioned Buses. Transportation has ordered 47 new Diesel buses. Next year, all our buses will have AC- a growing need as heat increases.







Sustainable Food (Update from Diane Grodek & Lindsey Bradley)

- AISD foods were featured in the Urban School Food Alliance
 Plant-Forward Edition of their School Bites publication.
 Foods featured included our Alfredo Flatbread, Asian Strips with Broccoli, Falafel Wrap, Lentil Chili Frito Pie, Honey Ginger Carrots, Peach Crisp and Strawberry Sorbet.

Warehouse (Update from Mark Curtis)

- Furniture reuse. We are collaborating with AISD Construction
 Management to connect the Wooten swing space furnishings
 with other AISD schools and recipients. The remaining materials
 will be collected as surplus for future requests and possible
 sales.
- The warehouse is providing logistical support for the Junior League of Austin's Coats for Kids drive. This year, we will deliver 7900 new and gently used coats to our students. Outdoor Wonder & Learning (OWL) (Update from Colleen Garland, Mandi Golman, & Joanna Orozco)

- The nature play area at the OWL Center at Metz is officially open for field trips! See the opening ceremony news story with Congressman Lloyd Doggett, Superintendent Segura, Trustee Boswell, and 5th graders from Sanchez.
- The OWL Center is soaring! We recently hosted 2 nature play field trips, 2 Austin Watershed Earth Camps in the learning courtyard, 1 Girls Outside field trip, and a group of UT Engineers are conducting a water study of the site for their capstone projects.
- Austin Parks & Rec hosted a <u>natural play training</u> at the OWL Center to showcase the first <u>Bienenstock nature play system</u> in Austin.
- Outdoor Learning staff, Mandi Golman and Colleen Garland, presented at the <u>Outdoor Leadership Summit</u>. 15 AISD staff

- joined to learn about the benefits of taking our students outside for learning and free play.
- **Amenity Reuse.** We have salvaged 90% of the outdoor amenities on our campuses receiving 2022 Bond program renovations.



Urban Forestry (Update from Sydnie Levell)

- Texas Conservation Corps (TxCC) is back! Thanks to a City of Austin Urban Forest Grant, Sydnie is leading crews November 10-21 in comprehensive tree pruning at Joslin Elementary and Clifton Career Development Center. This grant has enabled TxCC tree pruning at 18 campuses and 4 facilities since 2024.
- Tree Planting. TxCC will return in January to plant trees at Eastside ECHS (25 trees) and Govalle Elementary (15 trees).
- A <u>City of Austin Youth Forest Council</u> member is working with TreeFolks and AISD to add an additional 15 trees at Govalle Elementary. Stay tuned for the Spring volunteer opportunity to help plant these trees!
- AISD Tree Inventory. The City of Austin Youth Forest Council continues to assist with five interns updating AISD's tree inventory through <u>TreePlotter</u>.
