# AVID Student Engagement: Key Takeaways By Committee

## Academics / CTE

*What is NOT working at your school?*

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## Athletics

*What is NOT working at your school?*

- NEW ideas:
  - One group felt that “sports is not diverse and inclusive”
  - Issues with sexism from coaches, and some students are tired of the gender binary enforced in athletics (“gender binary is old”)
    - One group suggested co-ed athletics options
  - Tryouts are too stressful, sports generally too competitive (we heard similar comments from parents about over-competitiveness, but hadn’t heard this from committee members or district staff)
    - One group suggested adding less competitive options
- Reinforced:
  - Facilities + equipment are in poor condition and do not support athletics / PE
  - 6th graders would like access to participate in athletics! (said by committee members, but important that this is reinforced by that group themselves)
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## Facilities

*What is NOT working at your school?*

- NEW ideas:
  - Need different kinds of spaces for students to relax, meditate, and calm down
    - So that they can make better choices, and not choose violence - Sadler Means
  - Defunct furniture
  - **Stairs not wide enough - congestion leads to trouble - Murchison MS**
  - Pests
  - Bathrooms lack basic supplies: toilet paper, soap, paper towels
- Reinforced:
  - AC not working
  - Not enough bathrooms and/or in poor condition
  - Not enough lunch space

## Safety, Security & Resiliency

*What is NOT working at your school?*

- NEW ideas:
  - They are all working - Murchison MS
  - The counselors do not help and do not give good advice - Martin MS

- Dress code is too strict and not applied fairly to all students (like certain groups and girls and curvier girls), the dress code sexualizes children - Murchison MS
- Nurse is overworked and we have to wait too long to be seen - Murchison MS
- GoGuardian, scheduling with counselors. - Murchison MS
- Student to Teacher relationships, Prevention of bad rule following & access and ability to go throughout the school without restriction. - Eastside HS
- Security guards are biased. - Murchison MS
- Reinforced:
  - The cameras in half the school - Murchison MS
  - There could be more security at our school like more security guards and some backpack checks once in a while for safety and more practice drills. - Murchison MS
  - Not enough security guards. Teachers don't notice a lot. - Murchison MS
  - Students were getting into fights too often, not enough hall monitors. - Murchison MS
  - I think they should update the school security system. - Bertha Sadler Means

## Technology

*What is NOT working at your school?*

- NEW ideas:
  - Restrictive cell phone policies
  - Quality of Chromebook devices
  - Restrictive website access
    - One comment noted as a barrier for teacher to access educational materials
- Reinforced:
  - Teachers lacking sufficient technology training to operate equipment
  - Spotty / slow WiFi access
  - A/C, power, bells, printers - building infrastructure not working or lacking
  - Intentional balance of technology vs. analog in education

## Transportation, Food Services & Maintenance

*What is NOT working at your school?*

- NEW issues:
  - Transportation
    - Published bus route times are inaccurate/poorly coordinated or drivers don't wait long enough. (*Murchison MS*)
    - Seats on busses are worn down and there are no seatbelts. (*Northeast ECHS*)
    - Bus drivers drive too fast. (*Murchison MS*)
  - Food Services
    - Only offering milk as a drink at HS is not good. (*Northeast ECHS*)
  - Maintenance

- Outdated/broken indoor and outdoor furniture is a distraction (leans/tips) (*Northeast ECHS*)
- Reinforced issues:
  - Transportation:
    - School buses are overcrowded and discipline is not consistent, making students feel unsafe on the bus. (*Martin MS, Bertha Sadler Means YWLA*)
    - Bus drivers are mean or scary. (*Martin MS, Murchison MS*)
    - Buses break down regularly (*Bertha Sadler Means YWLA, Murchison MS*).
  - Food Services:
    - Food is not appealing or of questionable quality. (*Martin MS, Northeast ECHS, Murchison MS, Bertha Sadler Means YWLA, Eastside ECHS*)
      - “Food is expired”
      - “Food is uncooked/undercooked”
      - “Old or half-frozen food”/ “Food is clearly frozen, not fresh cooked”
      - “Food is not healthy or fresh”
    - Lunch lines are too long and it’s resulting in students not having enough time to eat. (*Murchison MS, Eastside ECHS*)
    - Students feel they don’t have meal options with dietary restrictions. (*Murchison MS*).
    - Students would like snacks or larger meal portions (*Northeast ECHS, Murchison MS*).
  - Maintenance
    - Student restrooms are not well kept up/maintained (closed for long periods or constantly require fixing). (*Martin MS, Murchison MS*)
    - Heating/AC is unreliable and breaks down frequently, affecting student comfort. (*Bertha Sadler Means YWLA, Murchison MS*)

## Visual & Performing Arts

*What is NOT working at your school?*

- New Issues
  - VAPA classes are not optional in middle school; this causes issues with overcrowding, students not taking coursework seriously; scheduling issues
  - There are no levels to arts (beginner/intermediate/advanced)
  - Teachers don’t take students seriously in theater programs (*Murchison Middle*)
  - Lack of performances (*Eastside Memorial*)
- Reinforced Issues
  - Students are not in the class types they want to be in (*Northeast ECHS*)
  - Lack of theater space (*Martin Middle*)
  - Not all students can sign up for the classes they want to take/not enough choice
  - Art rooms are not real art rooms
  - Equipment for band and orchestra is old
