Summitt Elementary School serves an enrollment of approximately 760 students in north Austin and was originally built in 1986. A detached building, referred to as "the annex," was built in 1989. The school provides multiple programs, has a large Vietnamese student enrollment and participates in a German exchange program. The school focuses on world languages as part of the Anderson family of schools, and at each grade level, students are exposed to Spanish, German, French, Chinese, and Latin. The ESA evaluates how well a facility supports teaching and learning using the district's Educational Specifications as the standard. It includes items such as the exterior, general building, security, controllability of lighting, furniture, academic and administrative spaces, and technology.
