
Facility Summary

Wooten Elementary School serves an enrollment of approximately 380 students in north Austin and is adjacent to Wooten Park, a public park. The building was built in 1955 and additions were constructed in 1960 and 1966. The school provides multiple programs, including dual-language and pre-K, and has an animal husbandry area to raise goats. The ESA evaluates how well a facility supports teaching and learning using the district's Educational Specifications as the standard. It includes items such as the exterior, general building, security, controllability of lighting, furniture, academic and administrative spaces, and technology.

The FCA evaluates the physical condition of a facility to measure what systems are broken, aging, etc. This includes items such as roofing, heating and air conditioning, plumbing, electrical, site drainage, and parking.

Both assessments incorporate data, staff interviews, facility walk-throughs, cost-estimating, and analysis.
