How do you define the community?

- This community is an under-resourced community; a lot of the original residents are still here and depend on each other for support and needs
- Lost history, lost things prominent to African Americans and have not recovered gentrification has impacted this community
- The community was built by African American women
- Community is...
 - o where you feel safe, included and welcomed
 - o a place where you have a voice
 - o its history, inhabitants, architecture and its boundaries

What are the challenges / needs of this community?

- Not a lot for youth to do in the area
- Voices are not heard and are competing with the money
- Lack of housing for...
 - Workforce
 - Affordable
 - Affordable housing being built is limited (the affordable housing set-asides on new construction are very small)
 - People on fixed income and with disabilities of all ages
 - Accessible housing is limited and people can wait decades
 - Retirees
 - Short-term housing (160 something unhoused individuals in the area)
- Lack of licensed child care centers
- Disconnect of the Older Eastside with the new neighborhood
 - Developers coming in and purchasing sites that could be serving the community but are ignoring the needs
- Have to go outside the community to secure resources
 - Healthcare, mental health services, housing options, childcare
 - In the past, was able to walk from the school and there were resources available for residents
- Need space for AISD schools during Bond modernization
- Walkability
- Access to fresh food

- Lack of space to support local businesses (storefronts, marketplaces, etc.) and lack opportunity to bring money into the community
- Important to ensure that we do not use the site in ways that causes further trauma for the community
 - Example of AISD Police using Sims for active shooter training
 - Police presence can be concerning/frightening
 - Need more transparency and communication when site is utilized
 - Need to be cognizant of the history
 - Need to complement the culture of the community (old and new neighbors) and bring back excellence
- Access to green space, especially as community continues to lose due to influx of apartment buildings being built
- Growth of Austin won't be changed need to do something to keep up

What future uses would you like to see at the Sims campus that would best address these needs and challenges?

- With the changing dynamics of the neighborhood, possibility to repurpose the facility and the land to provide different community focused spaces (garden, life skills, services)
 - BIPOC vendors, workforce and life skills, non-profit and community organizations can utilize the facility
 - Could be similar to a Resilience Hub (COA has created a department for this)
 - Important to connect with organizations that are already in this space (i.e.
 City of Austin, Austin Affordable Housing)
 - Can help to make sure it does not all fall on AISD's shoulders
- Multi-use facility that can employ local residents (include athletics)
- Similar use to YMCA center
- Trades training center workforce development
- Important for education to continue to be part of the future (vocational, CTE classes) and couple that with healthcare, community garden
 - Should be multi-purpose
- Utilize a portion of the facility as a propagation center
 - Employ local residents to work at center
- Green infrastructure which is lacking on the Eastside
 - Partner with nonprofits like Treefolks
- Adult continuing education
 - Connecting generations to support learning
 - Resource for the immigrant population

- Funding and resource that already exist so the building can be used immediately
- Cultural arts program
 - Dougherty Arts Center is located too far away
- Swing space for surrounding schools that will be undergoing modernization as part of the 2022 Bond
 - Can AISD utilize the Sims facility in lieu of placing students in portables?
 - Often no shade and concern about quality of portables
 - One community member expressed the opinion that AISD houses the programs/children that are less convenient in portables.
 - Who could it serve? The setup for elementary students is different from setup for middle school
 - Suggestion that it could be used by Sadler Means YWLA
 - Also suggestion to use it for nearby elementary schools slated for modernization, such as Oak Springs ES and Pecan Springs ES
 - Concerns about what investment would be required and the amount of time required to accommodate
 - What is the investment, length of time and how long can they be housed? How are we utilizing Bond dollars?
 - How long would the building be out of commission because of the swing? How long are we putting off the long term solution?
