Early Childhood Center / P-Tech

What do you like best about this option?

- ECC is critical for workers, real shortage in Austin; great way to utilize resource
- Interesting combination of ECC with P-Tech
- Like the idea of seeing children learning, especially those of our most economically disadvantaged families
- Honor the history of the space
- Idea supported by representatives from United Way given the clear need as 3M women left the workforce during COVID
 - Like building the pipeline of ECC educators
- Hits 4 of 5 of the criteria defined under educational purposes
- Former Pease parent shared they like little kids being at the school
- Considerations would be if move forward with ECC to including students with disabilities (UT could support as needed)
- In addition to child care I love the idea of parents having a space to learn, grow and receive support services as a parent community.
- Potential to prioritize offering ECC to District teachers (and staff)

What don't you like about this option?

- Concerns about asbestos exposure and lead paint
- Concerns about meeting code requirements for ECC
- Potential to take students away from existing campuses perhaps a focus on youngest students, and also offer dual language program

Cultural Arts Campus

What do you like best about this option?

- Worry that arts organizations are historically underfunded, how could any of them
 afford to fund this venture? The City would need a corporate benefactor like dell,
 etc, plus a partnership with nonprofits to administer. That's a complicated RFP.
- Definite need amongst the arts community; good way for the District to collaborate on the arts; open green space / play space
- Could integrate Pease history and culture in events

- Don't want the building used for storage
