The Department of Special Education developed an Accommodations Toolkit with some general recommendations for accommodations to use while implementing the AISD Human Sexuality & Responsibility (HSR) curriculum. This is not an exhaustive list and teachers are reminded to always refer to a student's IEP first when considering what accommodations to utilize.

Below are specific examples of accommodations that teachers might implement when teaching the High School HSR curriculum.

## For the **anonymous question box** provided during each lesson, consider the following:

- Provide a word/idea bank
- Provide written <u>sentence stems</u>
- Keep images available to generate ideas
- Allow student to dictate to teacher/aide or work with a responsible peer
- Allow verbal responses

# To support **comprehension of new vocabulary**, consider the following:

- <u>Preview vocabulary</u> or provide images for important vocabulary
- Provide vocabulary lists with user-friendly definitions and visuals
- Allow students with reading difficulties to read with a partner
- o Point out word parts and cognates

#### Lesson 1 Preparing to Learn

- Slide 2 Word Cloud
  - Allow students with reading difficulties to read with a partner
  - o Provide a vocabulary list with user-friendly definitions
  - Point out word parts and cognates

#### Lesson 1 - What is Sexuality?

- Slide 3 Sexuality
  - o Provide vocabulary lists with user-friendly definitions.
- Slide 4 What is Sexuality Activity
  - Provide a graphic organizer (i.e., <u>Frayer Model</u>) that includes the listed questions for students to discuss.
  - Consider providing sentence stems to support student responses.

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#### Lesson 2 - Dating/Romantic Relationships

- Slide 5 Relationship Spectrum Examples Activity
  - Allow students to work with a partner; provide reading support, if needed
- Slide 14 "25 Ways to Prevent Teen Dating and Sexual Violence" handout
  - Allow students with reading difficulties to read with a partner
  - o Increase the amount of white space on the page
  - o Provide written <u>sentence stems</u>
- Slide 15 Scenarios
  - Simplify text by rewording (break complex sentences into short sentences)

#### **Lesson 3 - Trafficking and Exploitation**

- Slide 3 Trafficking and Exploitation Statement Activity
  - Allow students to work with a partner
  - o Provide reading support, if needed
- Slide 10 Warning Signs
  - Allow <u>verbal responses</u>
  - Assign a <u>student partner</u> to help guide around the room
  - o Allow students to draw responses

#### **Lesson 4 - Reproductive Anatomy and Pregnancy**

- Slide 1 Intro
  - Teachers may provide copies of teacher scripts used in lessons and Powerpoints for students to review and follow along with, as the lesson is being presented.
- Slide 4 Reproductive Anatomy Review
  - This slide has great resources with word banks (see facilitator notes section of the slide) that could support students with the remainder of the lesson.

#### **Lesson 5 - Parenting & Paternity**

- Slide 13 Team Building Activity
  - Some students may need visual prompts for this activity
  - For students with mobility difficulties, assign a <u>student partner</u> to help guide around the room
- Slides 14 & 15 Effective Teen Parenting Handout
  - Highlight keywords/concepts
  - o <u>Preview the text</u>
  - o Allow students with reading difficulties to read with a partner

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#### **Lesson 6 - Boundaries & Abstinence**

- Slide 3 Setting Boundaries Activity
  - Some students may need reading support
  - For students with mobility difficulties, assign a <u>student partner</u> to help guide around the room
  - Allow the student to <u>dictate</u> to teacher/aide or work with a responsible peer

#### Lesson 7 - Method of Contraception (Staying Safe, Part 1)

- Slide 5 Contraception Card Activity
  - Some students may need reading support
  - For students with mobility difficulties, assign a <u>student partner</u> to help guide around the room

#### Lesson 8 - Sexually Transmitted Infections (Staying Safe, Part 2)

• Several of the handouts for this lesson are text-heavy with limited white space. Consider allowing students time to preview & discuss handouts with a trusted adult and/or highlight keywords/concepts.

#### Lesson 9 - Consent and Refusal Skills

- Slides 6 & 7 Tea and Consent
  - Provide a note-taking format to support comprehension & recall (i.e., graphic organizer)
- Slide 16 Refusal
  - Some students may benefit from practicing ways to refuse with a trusted peer or adult
