 - Standard Response Protocols
 - Hold, Secure, Lockdown, Evacuate and Shelter
 - Hold- (medical emergency, fight in school)

- Secure- (Police Activity near the campus or stray animal on campus grounds)
- Lockdown- (Active threat or immediate threat in the building)
- **Evacuate** (Fire, flooding, wildfire, or bomb threat)
- Shelter in place- (Weather or Hazardous material HAZMAT)
- SRP Communications- Passing of House Bill 3, anytime a threat is made to the campus, a letter must be sent home to the parents that a threat was made to that campus.
- District Training Information
 - AISD Emergency Management and the AISD Police Department have been working with district-level departments and after-school partners to conduct training for SRP and communicate that to the parents, communities, staff, etc.
