**PROCEEDINGS**

**Preliminaries**

- The open meeting was started by Lynn Boswell at 5:39 p.m.

**Public**

- David Simon made a comment letting everyone know of the coordinator of the committee. Zachary will take his place.

**Deliberations**

- At 5:42pm Trustee Bosswel introduced Kenneth Walker, General Counsel, to give updates about Student Safety During Walkouts
  - Students sometimes leave outside the building during school hours to exercise their 1st amendment rights.
  - It's difficult to account for and monitor students once they are outside the building.
  - Historically, the district has been able to manage student safety because the students are in proximity of the campus grounds.
  - Recently, however, students have been traveling long distances raising questions on how to ensure their safety near and away from campus.
- Safety Oversights:
  - Within 300ft of the campus, students are monitored by AISD administrators and AISD police.
  - Once students are off campus, local law enforcement will then monitor students.
  - If students do not return by the end of the school day, AISD will be unable to facilitate a return to campus (no physical force), and the absence will count as unexcused.
  - Some parents appreciate that AISD and APD are taking the necessary steps to protect the children while they express their concerns.
- Discussion
  - Trustee Bosswell asked whether there is a plan to notify the police department in advance of student walkouts.
  - APD representatives stated they would notify the sector sergeant and monitor the students' path. They will also alert Capitol DPD if students plan to march in that direction. Many students walk toward City Hall, city parks, or other public areas.
  - Most students comply with safety laws, including walking on the sidewalks. However, citations may be issued to students who are not following the law.
  - AISD students are peacefully protesting for the most part.
