Title VI, Class Size ReductionAnnual Report Card for Andrews Elementary

For the 1999-2000 school year, **Andrews Elementary** received one additional **first** grade teacher due to Class Size Reduction, a federally funded grants program (Title VI, Public Law 105-277). The goal of this program is to reduce class size in grades 1-3 to 18 or fewer students, so that teachers can provide more personal attention to students.

The Class Size Reduction Program Annual Report Card provides information on class size and student achievement during the grant period. Please note that for some campuses, the impact of the grant on class size may be partially masked by the inclusion of bilingual classes. That is, the addition of a regular classroom teacher typically would not affect the number or size of bilingual classes.

During the **1998-99** school year:

- There were six 1st grade classes;
- The smallest 1st grade class had 18 students;
- The largest 1st grade class had 26 students;
- On average, 1st grade classes had 20 students.

During the 1999-2000 school year:

- There were six 1st grade classes;
- The smallest 1st grade class had 15 students;
- The largest 1st grade class had 23 students;
- On average, 1st grade classes had 18 students.

- Fifty-seven percent of first grade students at Andrews Elementary scored at or above grade level on the Reading Comprehension portion of the Primary Assessment of Language Arts and Mathematics (PALM) in April, 2000.
- PALM data were unavailable from the district for April, 1999.
