RESULTS OF THE AISD HIGH SCHOOL EXIT SURVEY CLASS OF 2008

BOWIE HIGH SCHOOL

The sixth annual AISD High School Exit Survey was administered online¹ to seniors in every AISD High School during the Spring of 2008. This report contains the results for the Bowie High School Class of 2008. Where available, longitudinal data are presented to compare with the current 2008 responses. In addition, average results from all AISD high schools are presented alongside results for Bowie for comparison purposes. In total, 3,192 students in the Class of 2008 completed the survey, including 568 students from Bowie. Longitudinal tests for statistical significance were conducted with district-level data (see district-level report).

Student responses are organized into seven general topics areas: Open-Ended Comments; Postsecondary Intentions and Family Support; High School Experiences, Campus Climate, and Civic Engagement; Instruction and Technology; Postsecondary Preparation and Advising; and Final Thoughts. Some of the notable trends at this campus include:

- **Computer Access.** It seemed Bowie seniors had more high speed Internet access at home than did other seniors.
- Extra help to graduate. It appeared Bowie seniors received less help in the school year to graduate on time than did AISD seniors as a whole.
- *ACC College Connections*. Compared to seniors district-wide, Bowie seniors seemed to have participated more in *ACC College Connections*.
- **Paying for college**. There is some indication that Bowie seniors were more likely to plan to use family savings to pay for their education after high school than were AISD seniors as a whole.

INDIVIDUAL ITEM RESPONSES FOR BOWIE HIGH SCHOOL

OPEN ENDED COMMENTS

The first item on the survey is open-ended so that students have the opportunity to give feedback to district administrators before they have received any prompts or exposure to the broad themes within the survey. The responses below are to the question, "What is the ONE thing that you especially want the administration of AISD to know?"

Four hundred and twenty-five Bowie students (75%) provided a response³. Comments mostly focused on scheduling and class requirements. Bowie seniors felt advisory period was ineffective because as upperclassmen they did not need more college and career preparation. Most students also perceived the attendance and tardy, cell phones, and dress code policies to be too strict. Commonly identified themes expressed by the Class of 2008 include:

- Advisory period. Similar to other campuses, Bowie seniors' reports of advisory period were overwhelmingly negative. Students felt advisory took time away from their other classes and workload. "Advisory did not help me at all, it made me stay at school later and have to be late to work so it is very inconvenient. We usually just sat around and played games." "Advisory is completely pointless. It is a waste of class time and ruins that days schedule. For most seniors and juniors it is simply a thirty minute period to sneak off campus and go get coffee or food at Whataburger." Another student said "Advisory, though it is a mandatory class now, is not worth the students' or teachers' time. Nothing really gets accomplished during the advisory classes."
- Attendance and tardy policies. Many students wanted the final exam exemption policy to be reinstated. "Seniors should be able to exempt finals, again... like they used to be able to." and "I would want AISD to know that their decision to stop allowing finals to be exempted should be rethought." Students also felt the consequences for having an unexcused tardy were too harsh. "The tardy is ridiculous, it makes us later than we already are. Then, we end up having to skip class in order to not go to alc/get suspended." and "It doesn't help the students to suspend them for tardies, it just makes the situation worse."
- Cell phones and dress code. The bans on cell phones and certain clothes were considered to be unfair by the seniors. "that cellphones are an essential part of life and will be that way from now to something new comes along but until then this is the way many parent get in contact with there children so taking them and not returning them is not exceptable." Other students said "Many of the regulations regarding the school dress code are not equally inforced." and "the dresscode is ridiculous, some of it may be needed but come on its not fair to judge the length of someones shorts by how far their arms come down!"

Figure 1. To What Extent Do Your Parents / Family Support Your Plans for After High School? (Item 11)









Figure 4. On Average, What Percentage of Your Study, Research and Homework Was Done Without Distractions (e.g., Television, Music, IM, Texting, Phone Calls, etc.)? (Item 24)







Figure 6. How Helpful Was Your Project ADVANCE Facilitator/College Advisor in the Following Types Of Meetings? (Item 37)









Figure 8. How Helpful Was Your Advocate/Advisory Teacher in the Following Types of Meetings? (Item 40)

Figure 9. How Helpful Was Your School Counselor in the Following Types of Meetings? (Item 41)







