## HIGH SCHOOL EXIT SURVEY REPORT FOR CLASS OF 2009, BOWIE HIGH SCHOOL

The sixth annual Austin Independent School District (AISD) High School Exit Survey was administered online to seniors in every AISD high school during Spring 2009. Facilitators on each campus, primarily *Project ADVANCE* counselors, were responsible for ensuring that all graduating seniors were given the opportunity to complete the survey.

This report contains the results for the Bowie High School Class of 2009. Where available, longitudinal data are presented to compare with the 2009 responses. In addition, average results from all AISD high schools are presented alongside results for Bowie for comparison purposes. In total, 3,365 students in the Class of 2009 completed the survey, including 547 students from Bowie. Longitudinal tests for statistical significance were conducted with district-level data (see district-level report). Table 1 presents longitudinal response rates by campus and by district. Next, major findings are presented, followed by open-ended campus-level responses and, finally, responses to the multiple choice items from the survey.

The report is structured as follows. First, a brief summary of key findings from the 2009 High School Exit Survey is provided. This summary is followed by a selection of open-ended student comments that capture the predominant themes that emerged from the student comments. Last, the detailed, item-specific results for each question from the survey are presented.

#### **Major Findings**

Student responses are organized into seven general topics areas: Open-Ended Comments; Postsecondary Intentions and Family Support; High School Experiences, Campus Climate, and Civic Engagement; Instruction and Technology; Postsecondary Preparation and Advising; and Final Thoughts. Some of the notable trends at this campus include:

- Computer Access. Bowie seniors claimed that their parents used GradeSpeed/ParentConnect at a higher rate than seniors at other campuses. Related to this, Bowie seniors appear to have greater home internet connectivity than seniors at other campuses.
- *ACC College Connections*. For two consecutive years, compared to seniors district-wide, Bowie seniors seemed to have participated more in *ACC College Connections*.
- Paying for college. There is some indication that Bowie seniors were more likely to plan to use
  family savings to pay for their education after high school than were AISD seniors as a whole.
  They were also less likely than were all other AISD seniors to be unsure about how they plan to
  pay for college.

#### INDIVIDUAL ITEM RESPONSES FOR BOWIE HIGH SCHOOL

#### **OPEN ENDED COMMENTS**

The responses below are to the question, "What is the ONE thing that you especially want the administration of AISD to know?"

Two hundred and ninety-two (53%) students provided a response. Comments mostly focused on technology usage, Advisory, and campus rules. Overwhelmingly, Bowie seniors felt advisory period was ineffective. In addition, several students requested that arts funding at Bowie be raised. Commonly identified themes expressed by the Class of 2009<sup>1</sup> include:

- Advisory period. Similar to other campuses, and consistent with last year's results, Bowie seniors' reports of advisory period were overwhelmingly negative. Students felt advisory took time away from their other classes and workload. "Advisory cut into what could've been a lot of valuable learning time. I did not really get any valuable information out of the advisory period at my school." "Use advisory more adequately! There are many things such as deadlines (i.e. deadline to get scholarships into graduation program) that can be told to us through advisory but are NOT." "Advisory is lame. If you want me to do better in school, then don't cut the amount of time that I spend in my classes to do pointless activities. I care more about my education than I care about my peers."
- Cell phones and dress code. The bans on cell phones and certain clothes were considered to be unfair by the seniors. ""The restrictions at Bowie, dress code and electronics policy, are more distracting than the problems that are trying to be prevented." "The rules regarding electronics are silly, and I'm pretty sure you guys know that." "The strict rules with cell phones and ipods are absolutely ridiculous. One should not have to turn in a cell phone for two days AND pay money to get it back for the first offense. A student should not have to give the"
- Arts funding. Several students expressed dissatisfaction with the level of arts funding at Bowie. "GIVE THE FINE ARTS MORE FUNDING AT BOWIE!!! The band really needs it.." "bowie needs a better theatre and practice field, several organizations use these and they are being warn thin. please fix this so we can keep up with what we are doing and prehaps better."




Figure 4. On Average, What Percentage Of Your Study, Research And Homework Was Done Without Distractions (E.G., Television, Music, IM, Texting, Phone Calls)? (Item 20)



Figure 9a. What Is The *One Thing* That Was Most Important To Keeping You Going Through School All The Way To Graduation? (Item 48, Bowie)




Figure 9b. What Is The *One Thing* That Was Most Important To Keeping You Going Through School All The Way To Graduation? (Item 48, All High Schools)
