



2005-2006 AISD Parent Survey Results

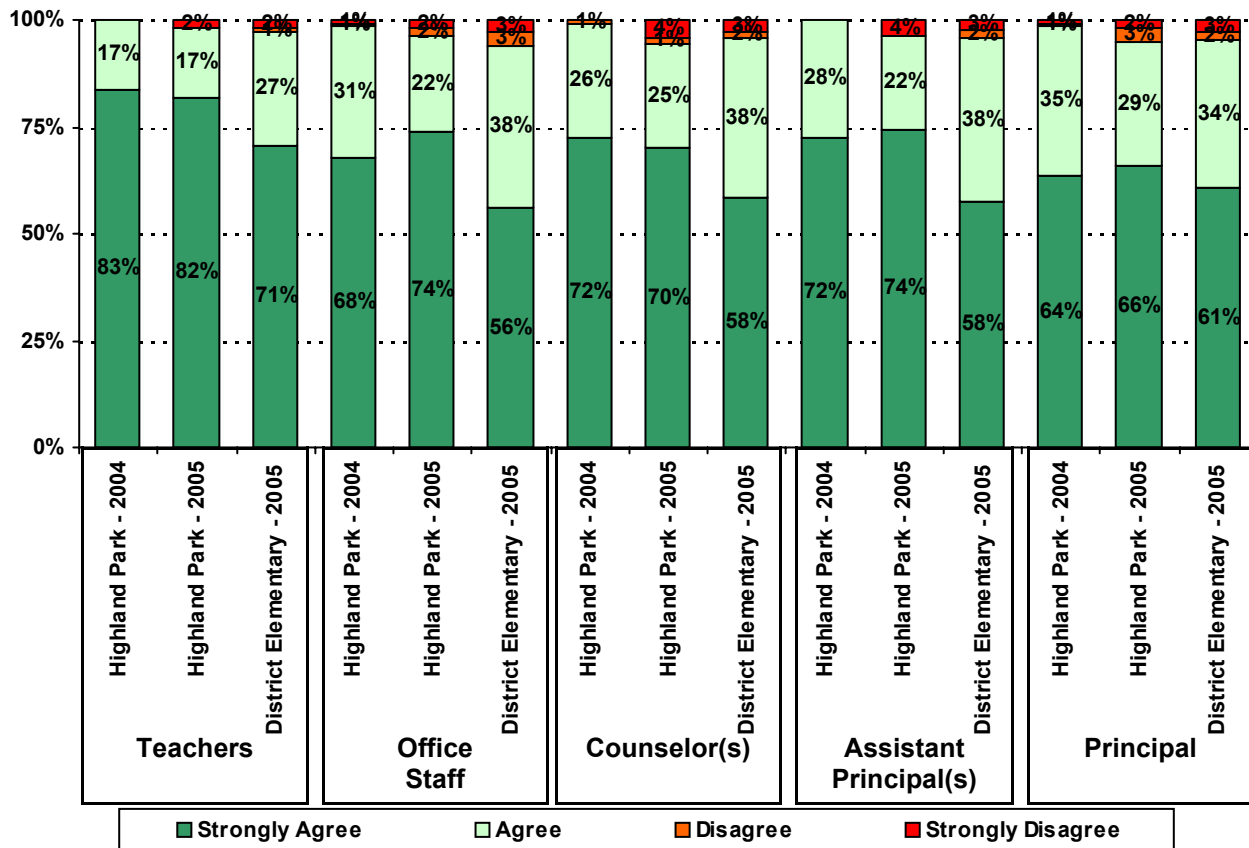
USING THE RESULTS OF THE AISD PARENT SURVEY

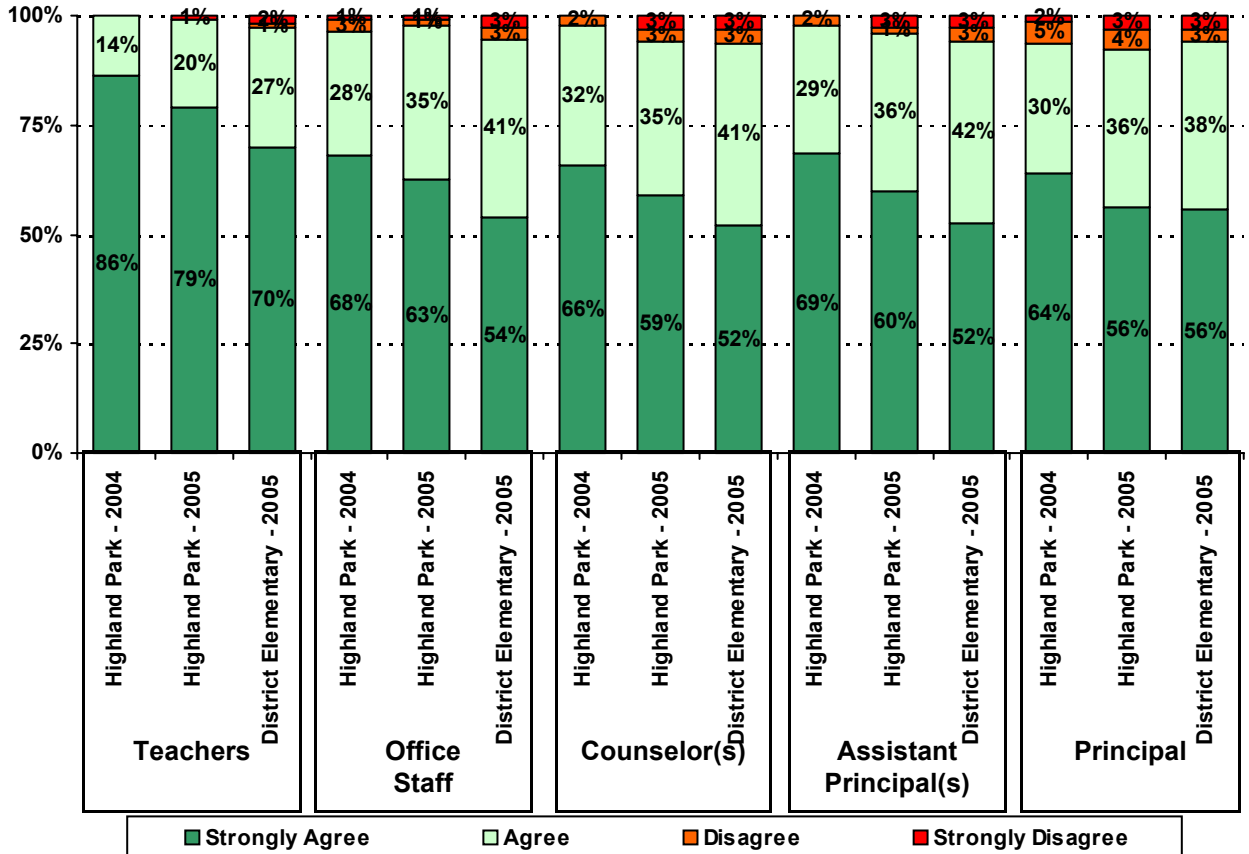

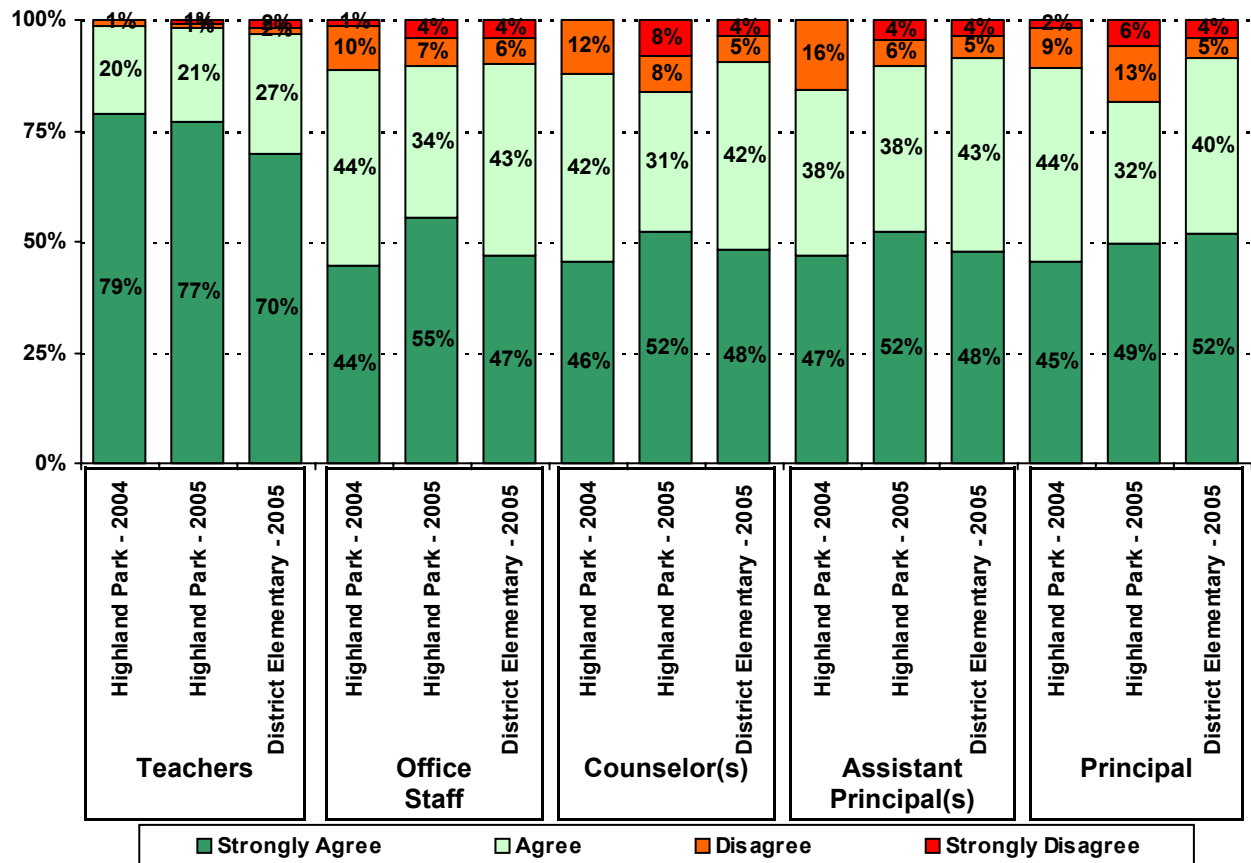

5. The following school staff provide me with opportunities for two-way communication.

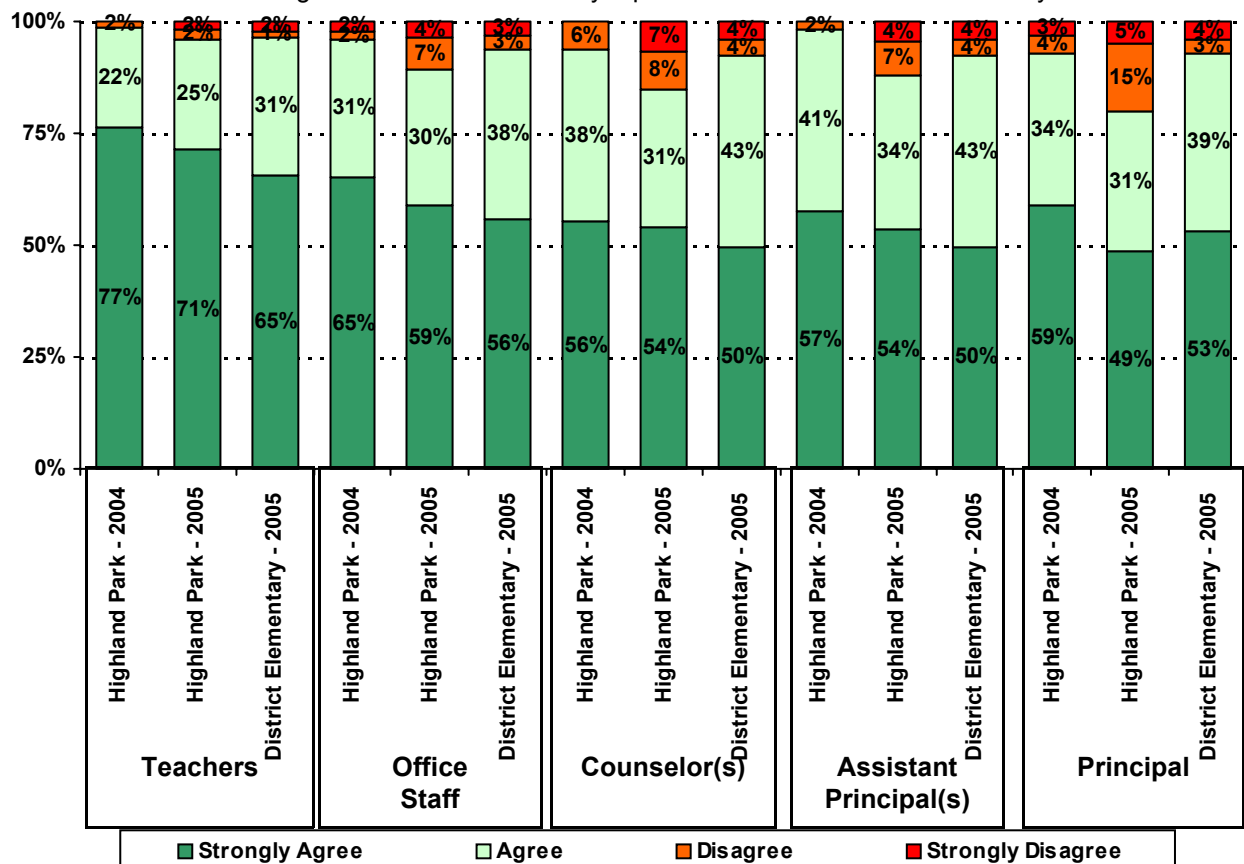

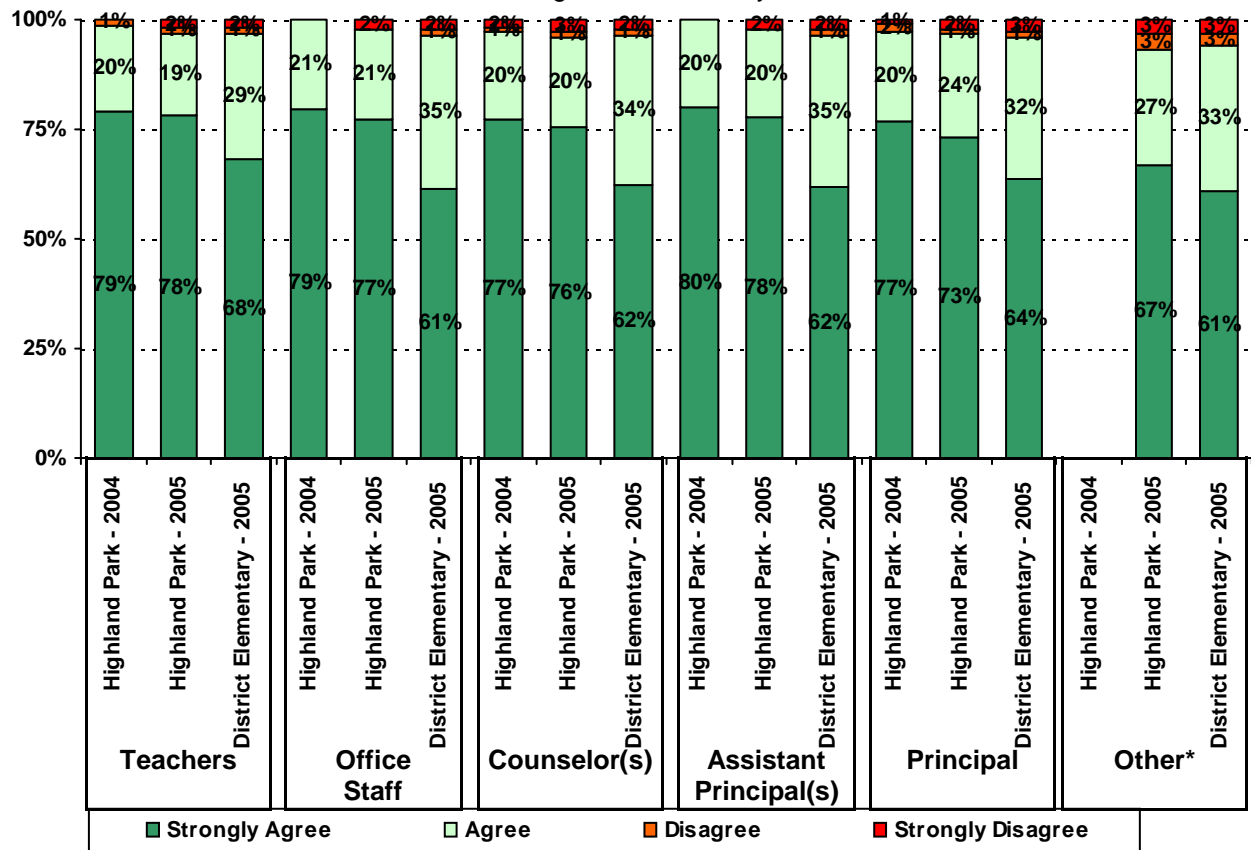
6. The following school staff have helped me to become more involved in my child's education.



7. The following school staff welcome my input in academic decisions about my child.

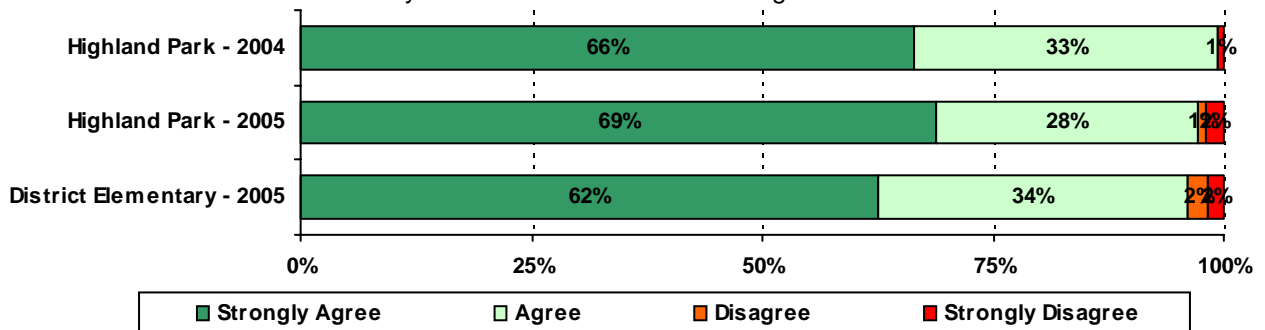


8. The following school staff treat my child fairly with respect to culture, gender, ethnicity, age, religion, and disability.

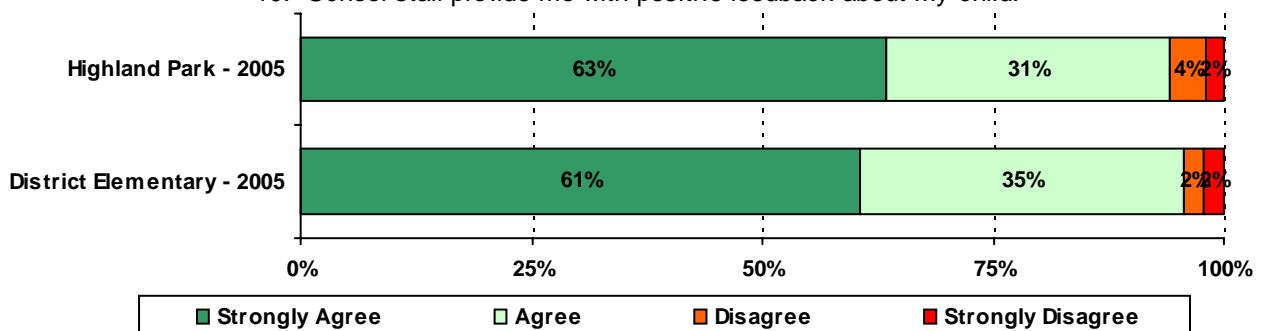

9. My child's school is a safe learning environment.

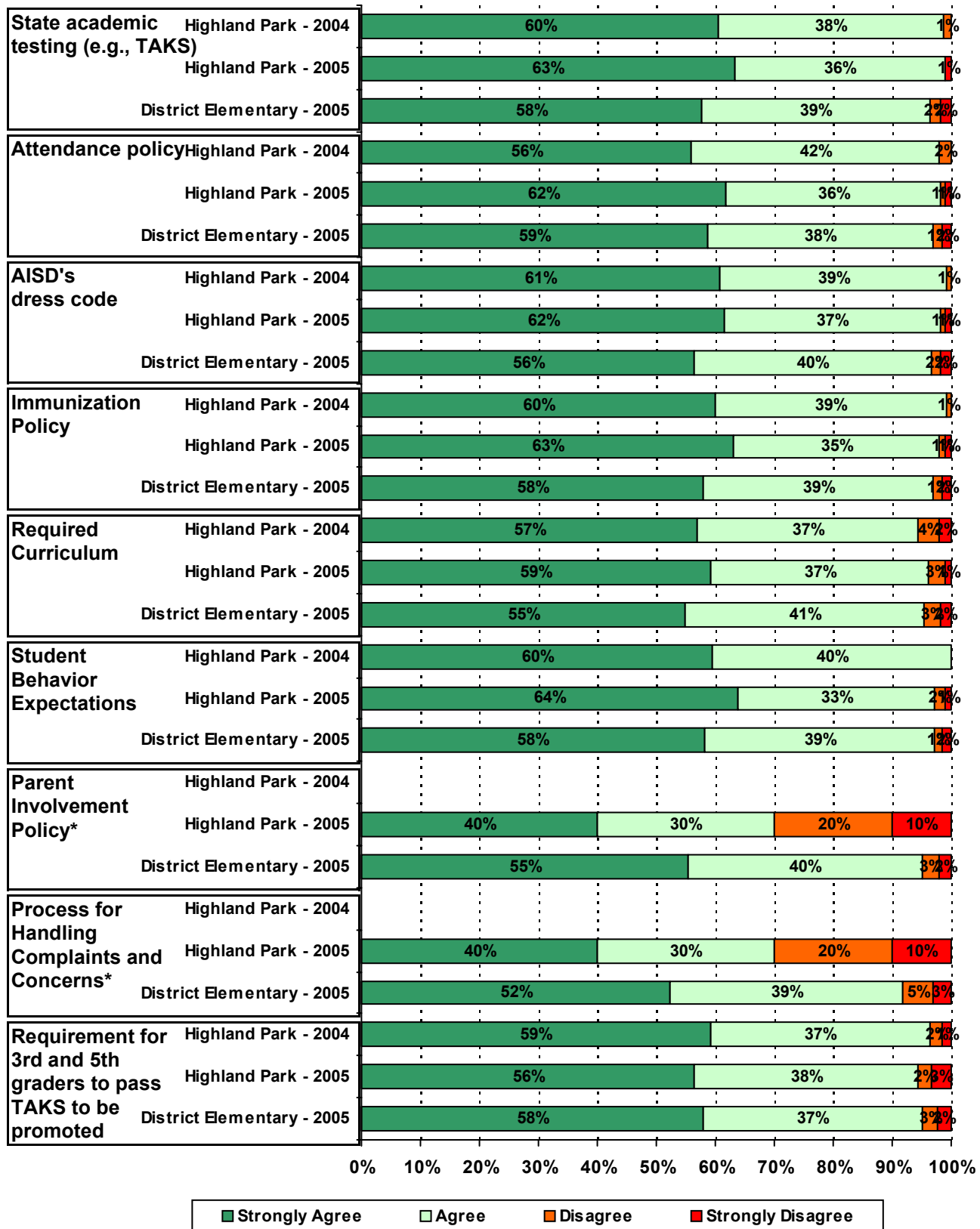


10. School staff provide me with positive feedback about my child.*



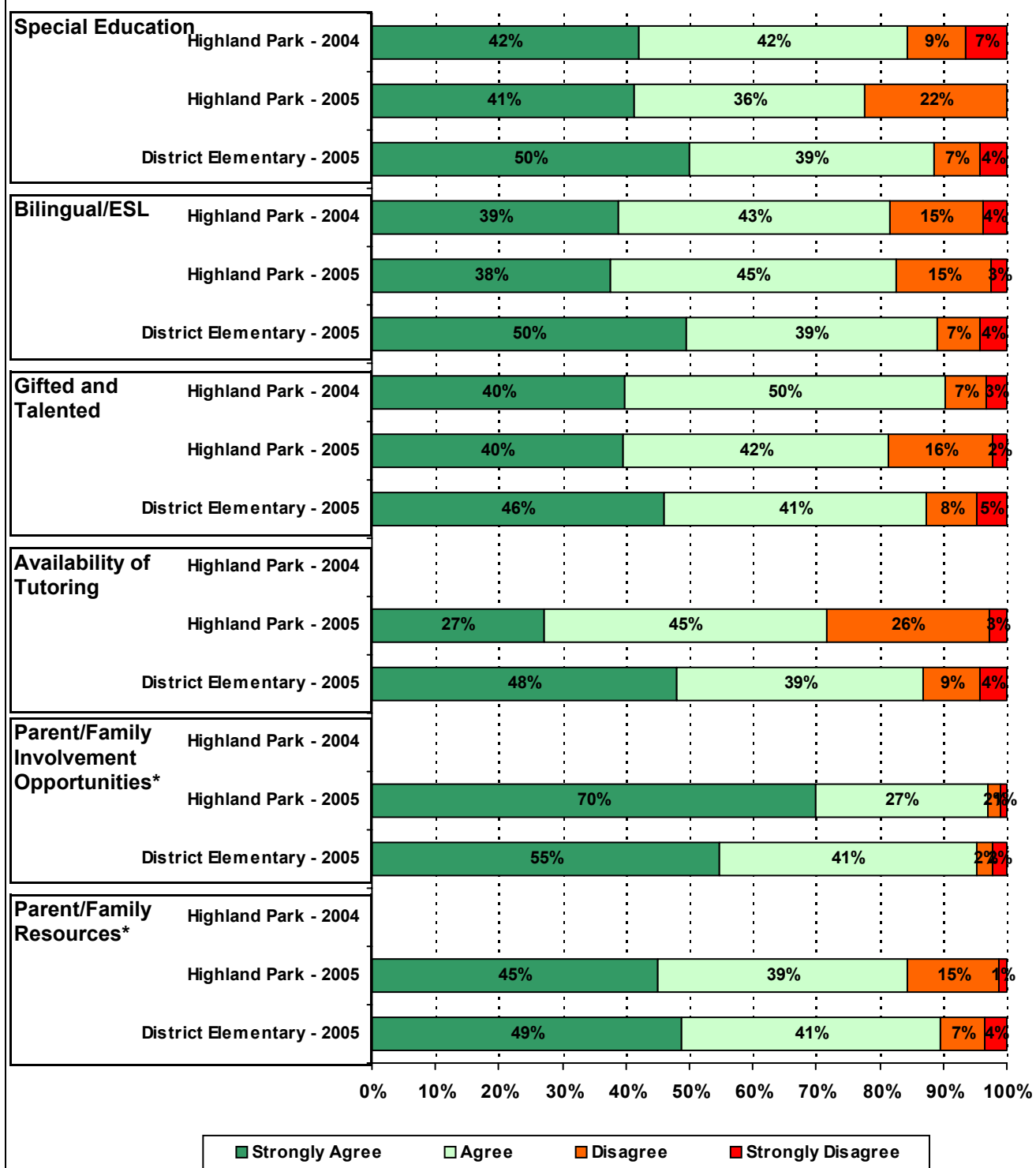

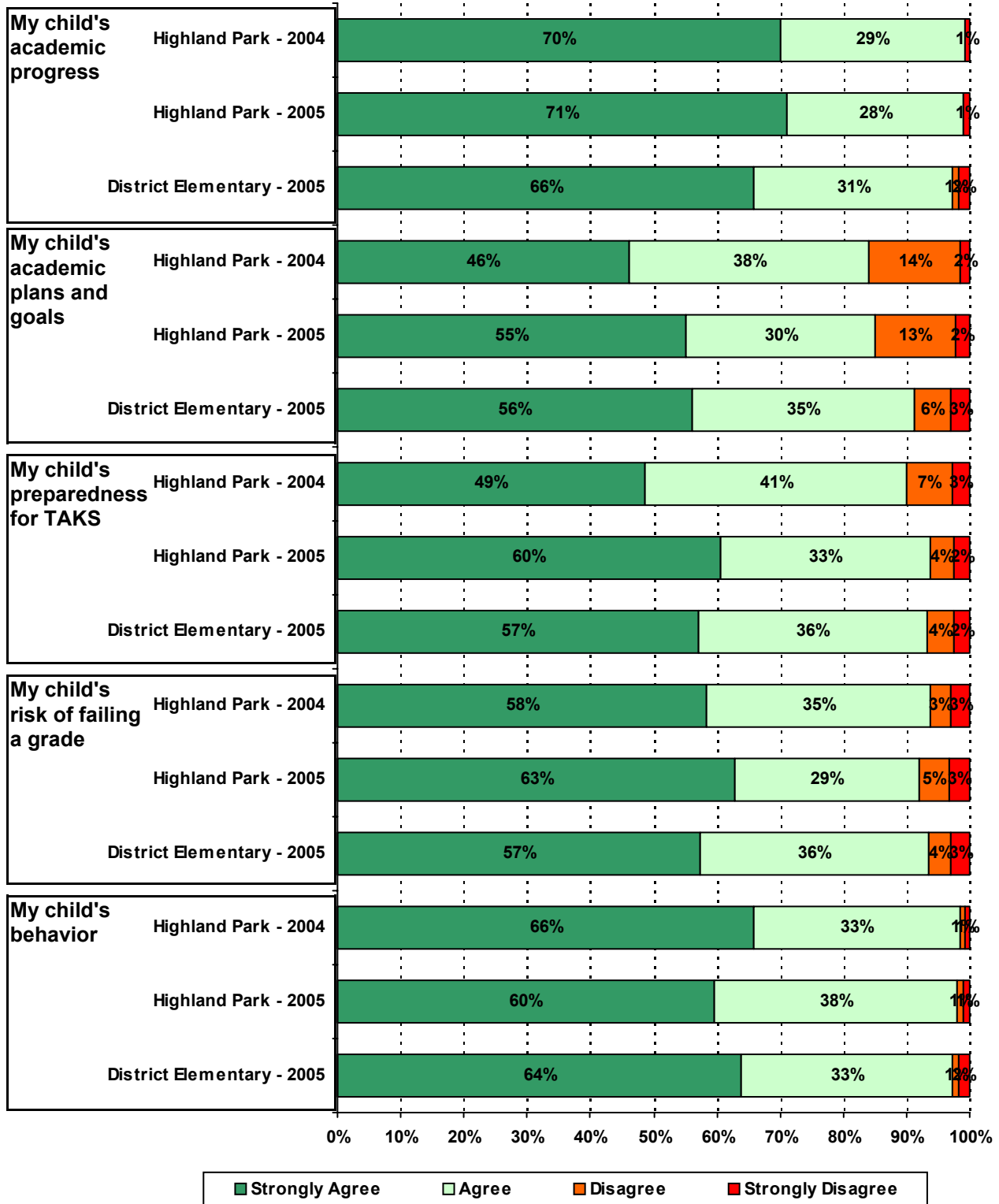

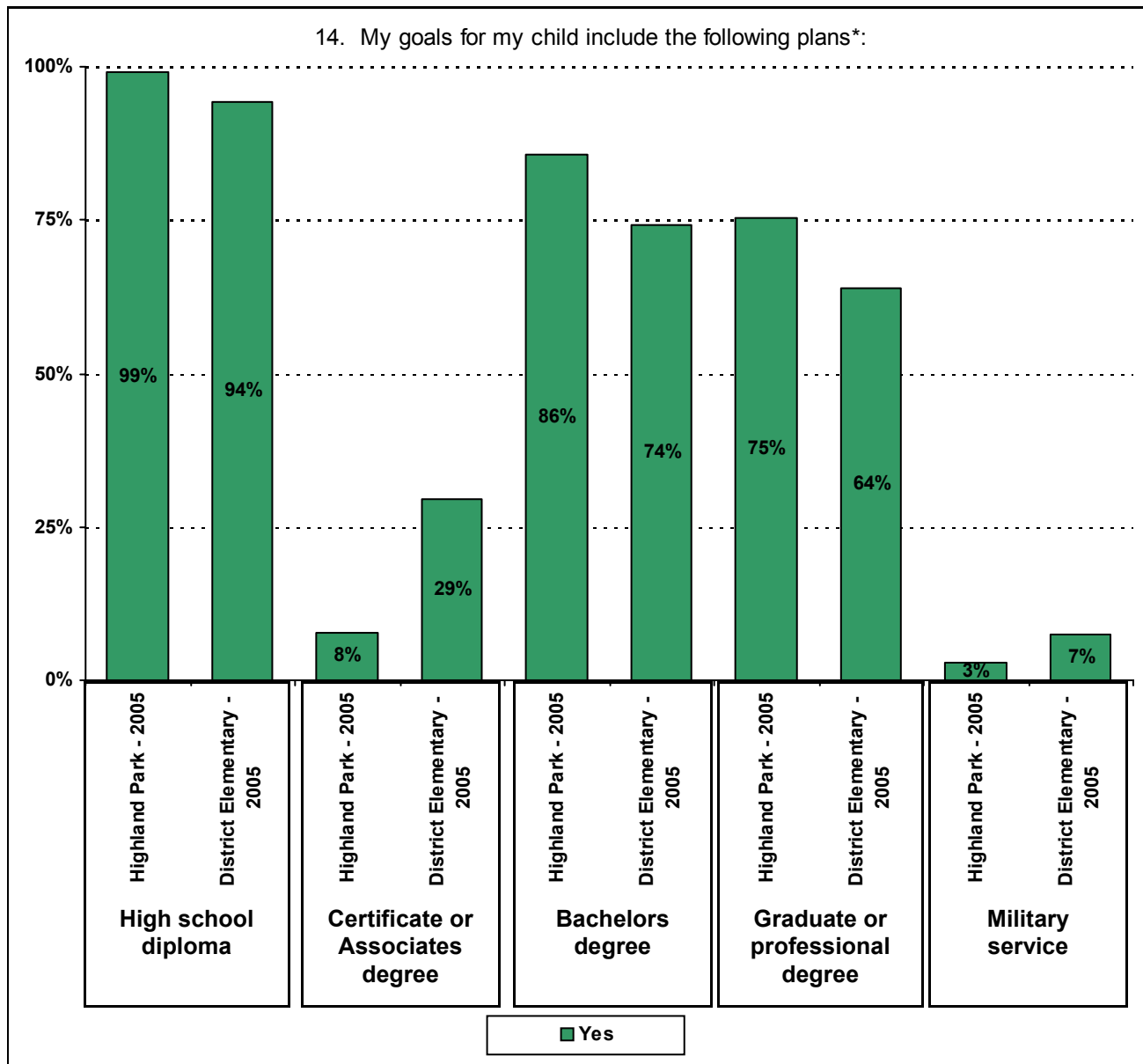
