

AISD Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) Skills Survey: Results for 2016

LEE

In partnership with the Collaborative for Academic, Social, and Emotional Learning (CASEL), and as part of AISD's participation in CASEL's Collaborating Districts Initiative (CDI), AISD model SEL elementary schools administering the survey online asked 3rd through 5th grade students to self-assess their SEL skills. This report shows the percentage of students who indicated the 20 skills were 'very easy' or 'easy' for them to do.
