



2005-2006 AISD Parent Survey Results

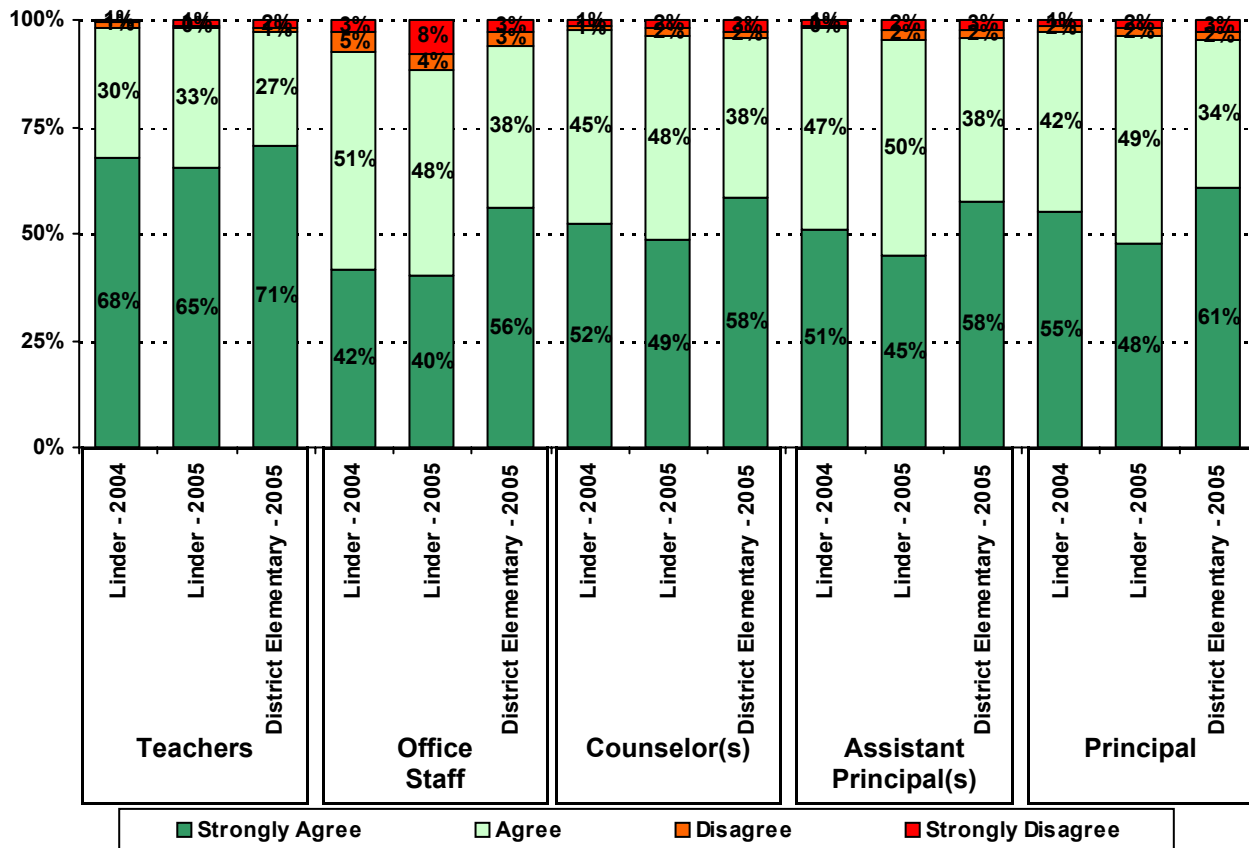
USING THE RESULTS OF THE AISD PARENT SURVEY

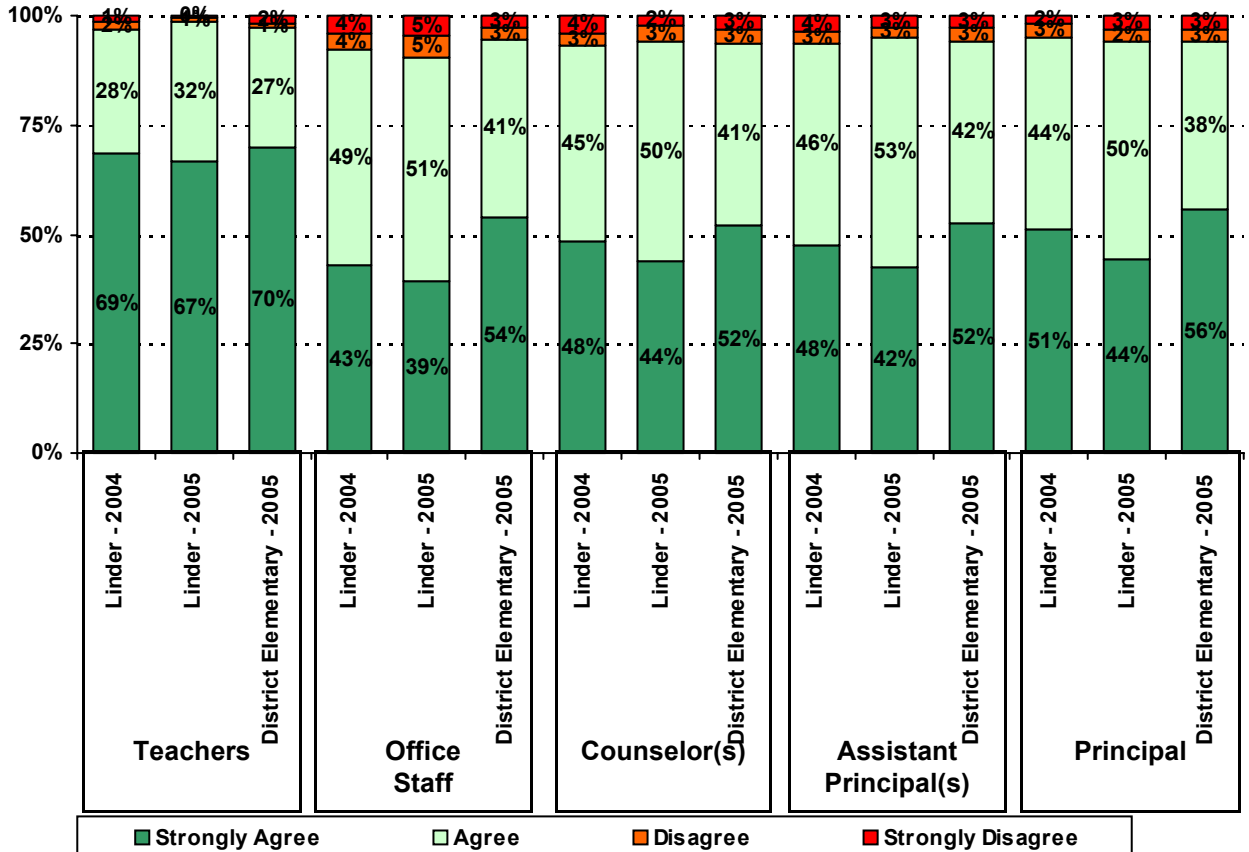
Please examine your results to determine areas of strength and opportunities for improvement. Opportunities for improvement can be identified by large percentages of parents who "Disagree" or "Strongly Disagree" with a statement. In addition, please look for patterns in which one staff category consistently receives more positive or negative responses than other staff categories. This will help you to identify opportunities for praise and areas in which training may be necessary. District responses for all schools at your level are also provided for comparison with 2005-2006 responses from your school. If your campus percentages are very different from the percentages reported by parents district-wide, please consider potential reasons for discrepancies.

With the longitudinal data that are provided, where available, look at the responses from year to year to determine whether there are any areas in which percentages have changed by more than a few percentage points. 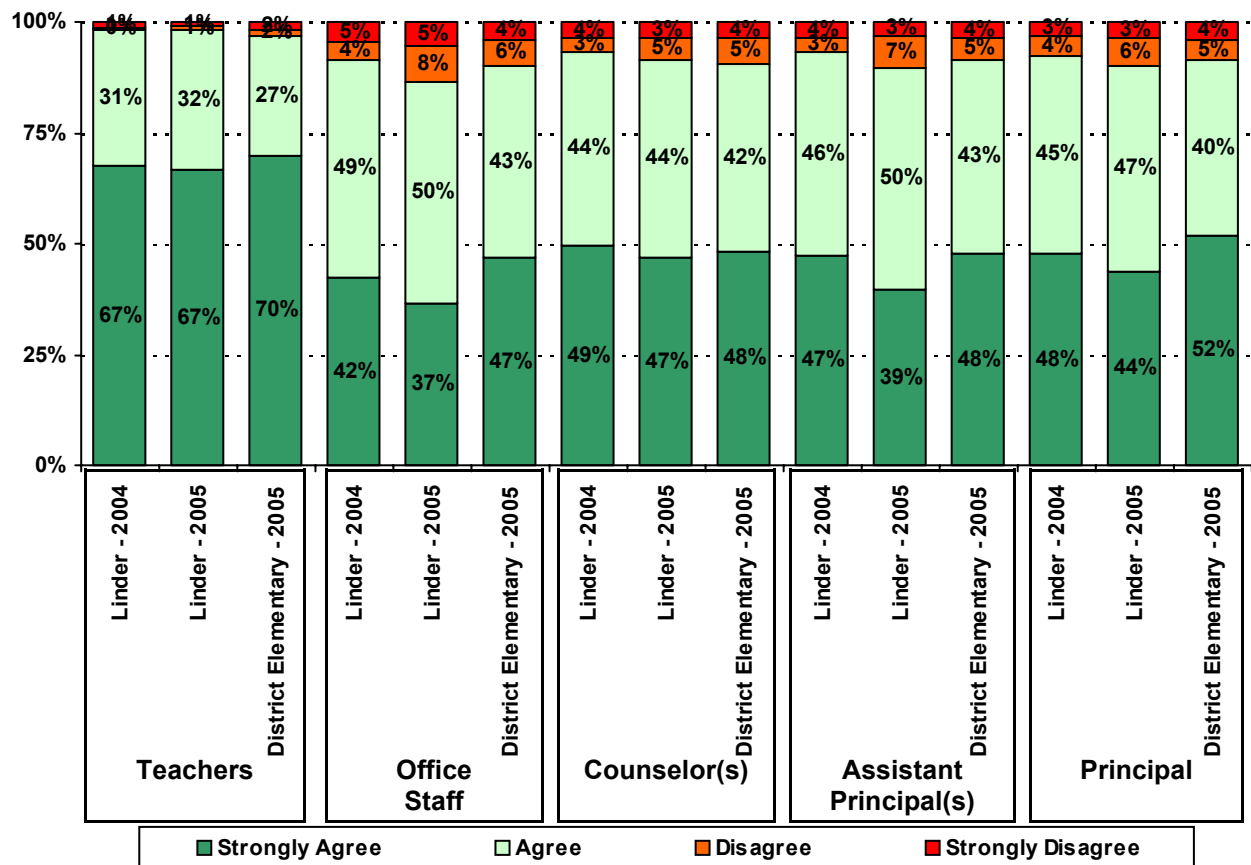

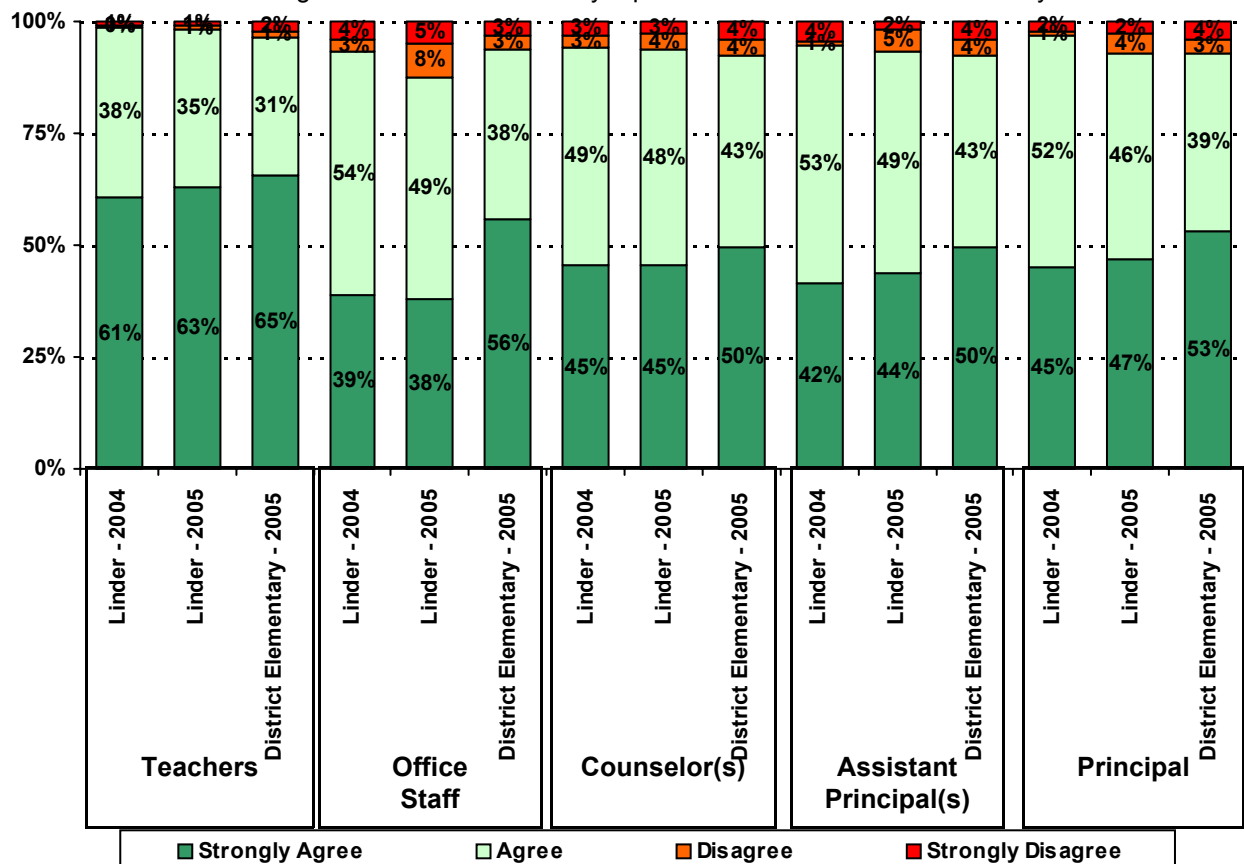
5. The following school staff provide me with opportunities for two-way communication.



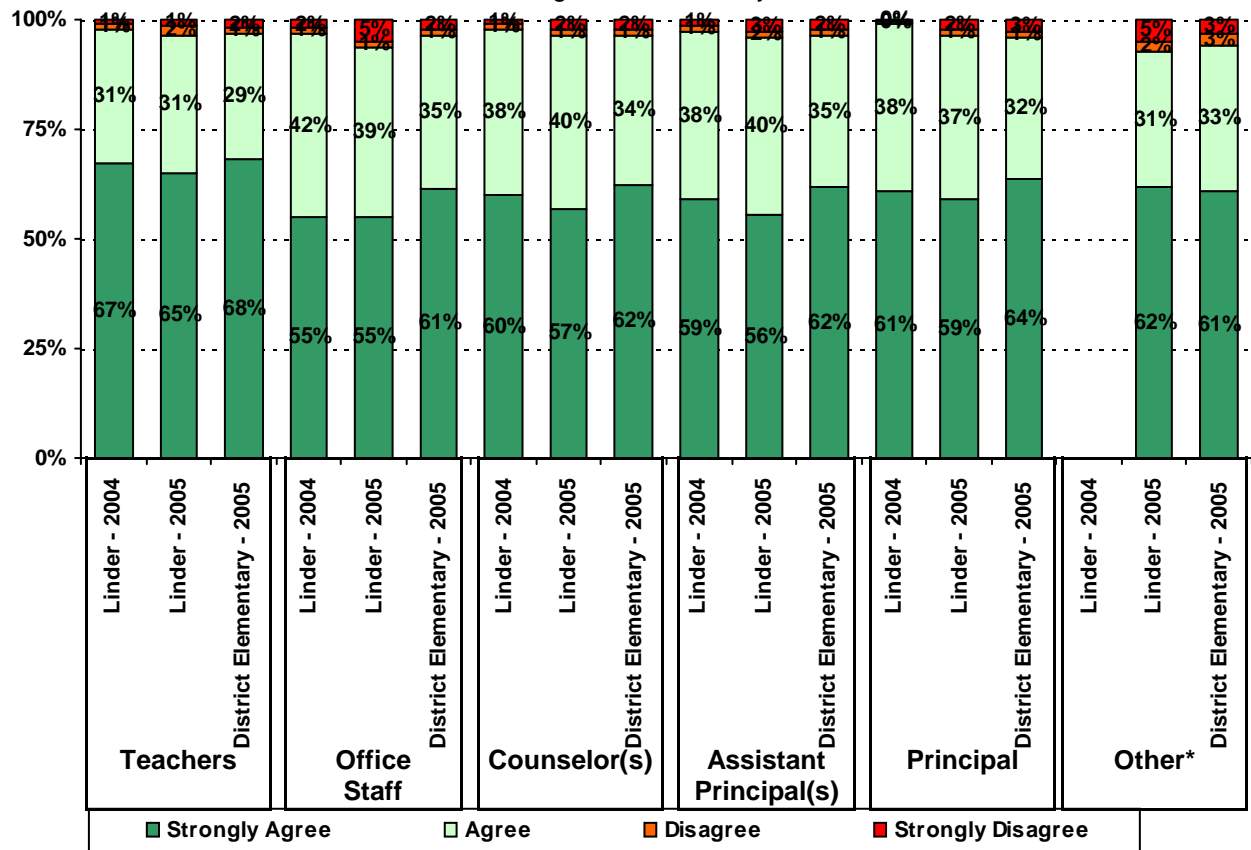
6. The following school staff have helped me to become more involved in my child's education.



7. The following school staff welcome my input in academic decisions about my child.

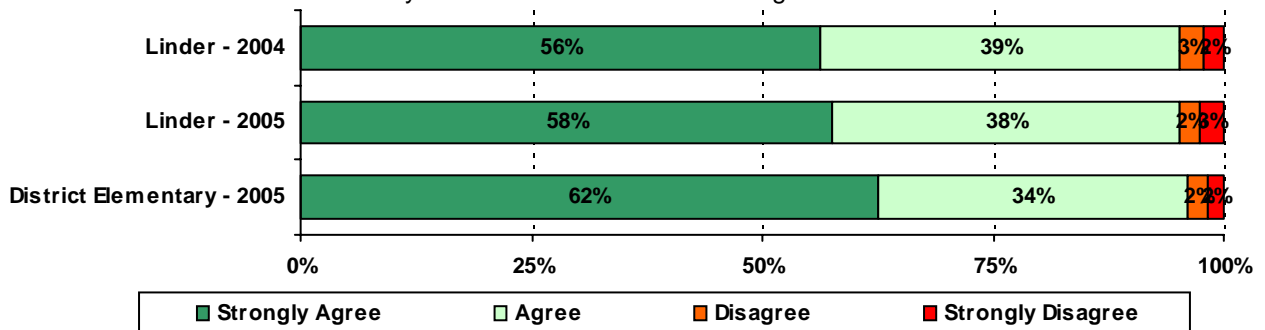


8. The following school staff treat my child fairly with respect to culture, gender, ethnicity, age, religion, and disability.

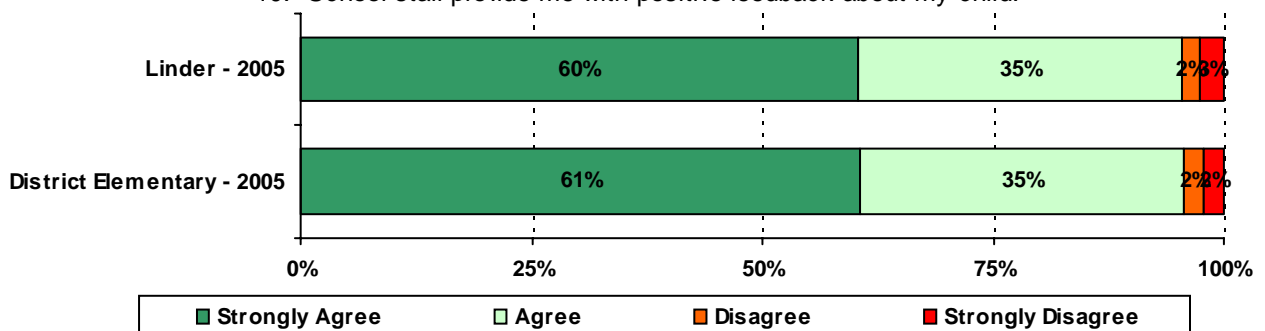

9. My child's school is a safe learning environment.

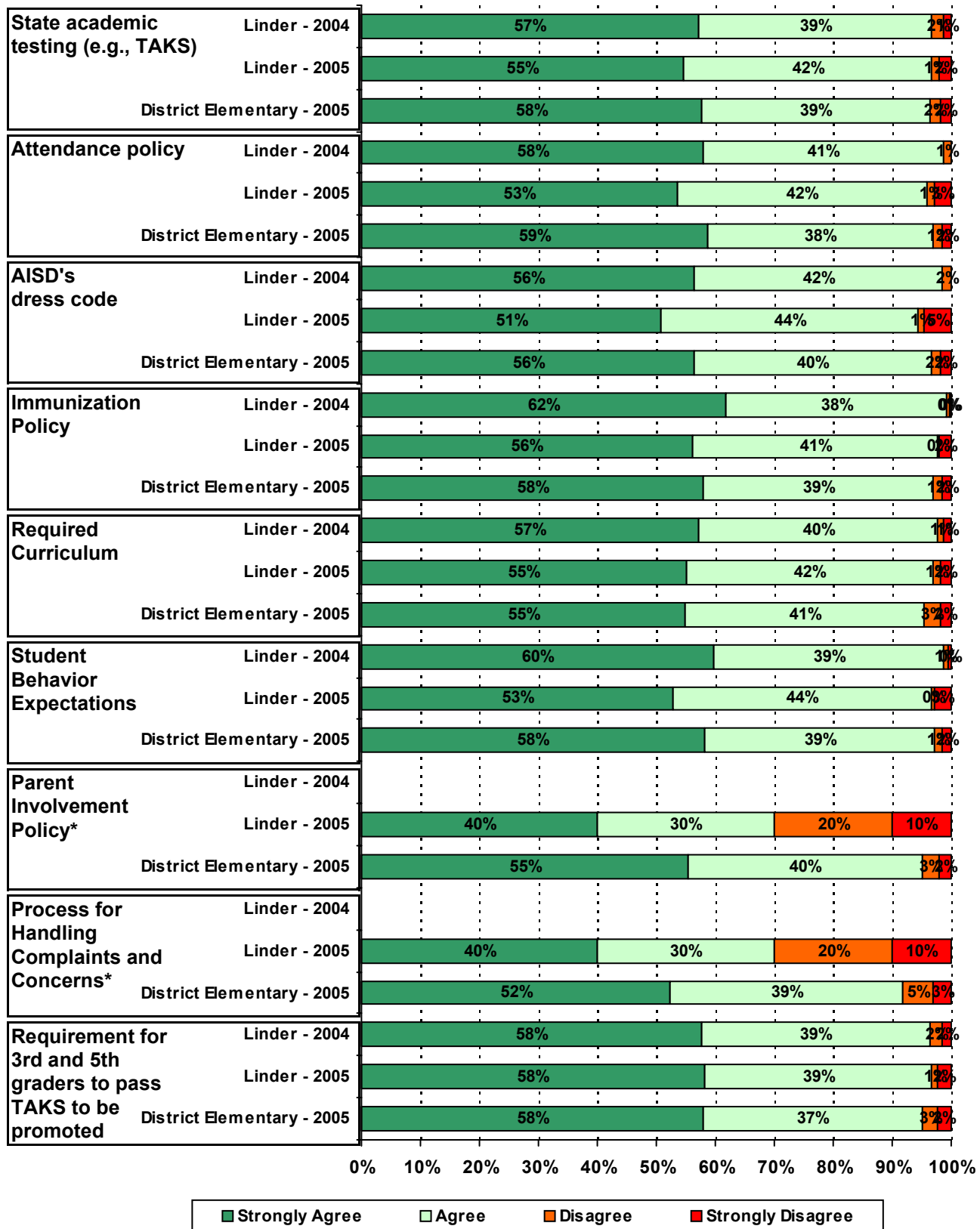


10. School staff provide me with positive feedback about my child.*



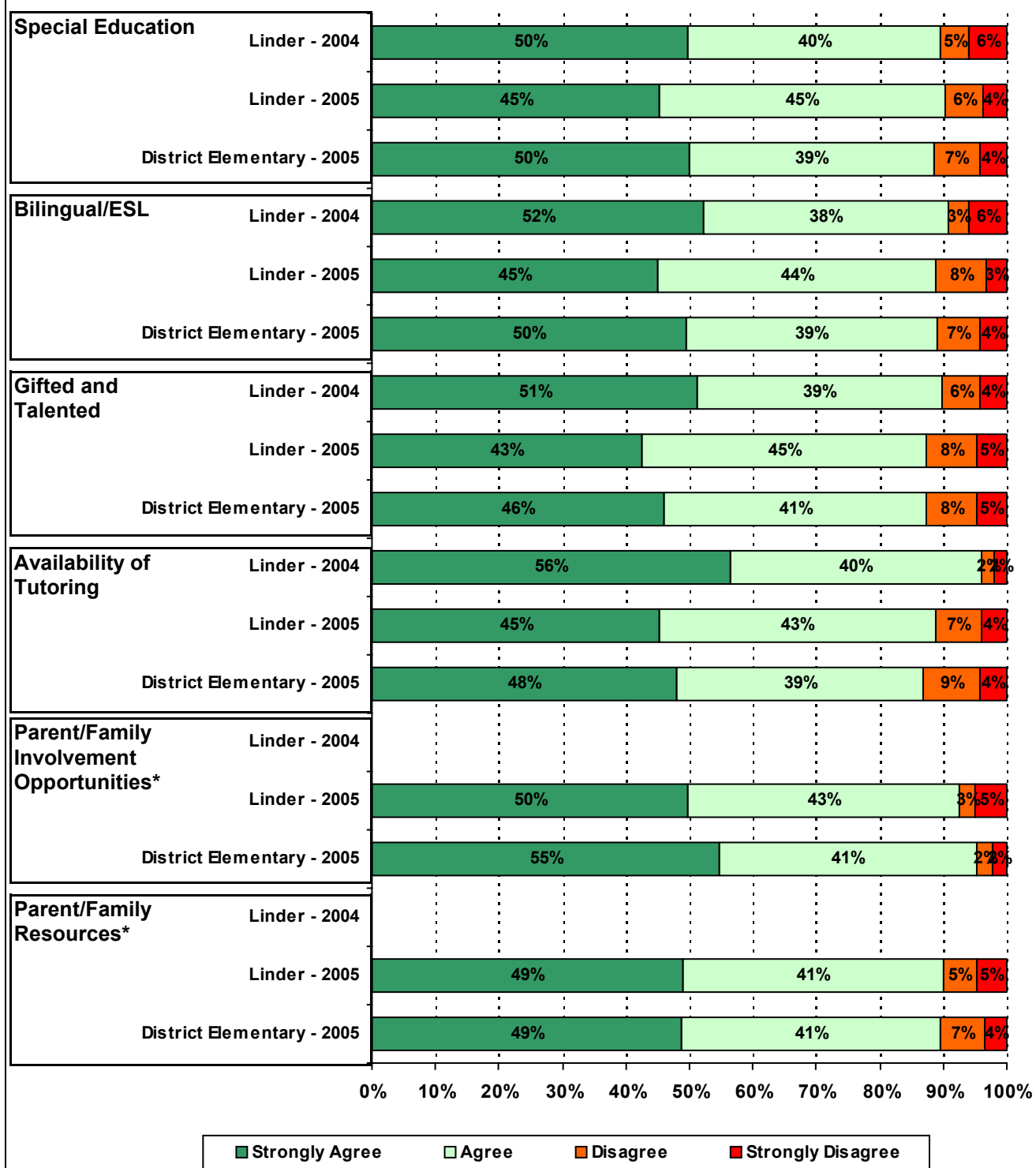

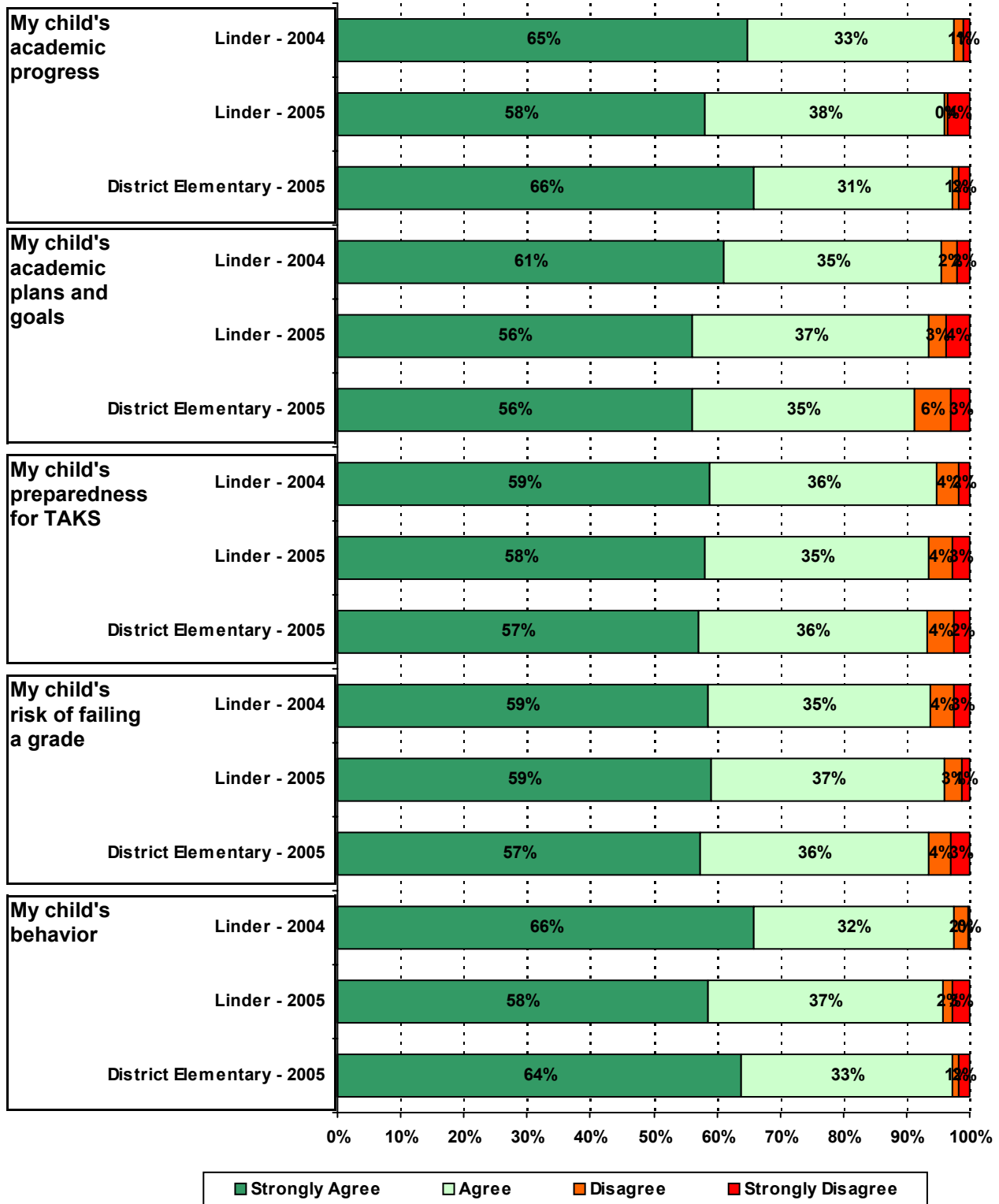

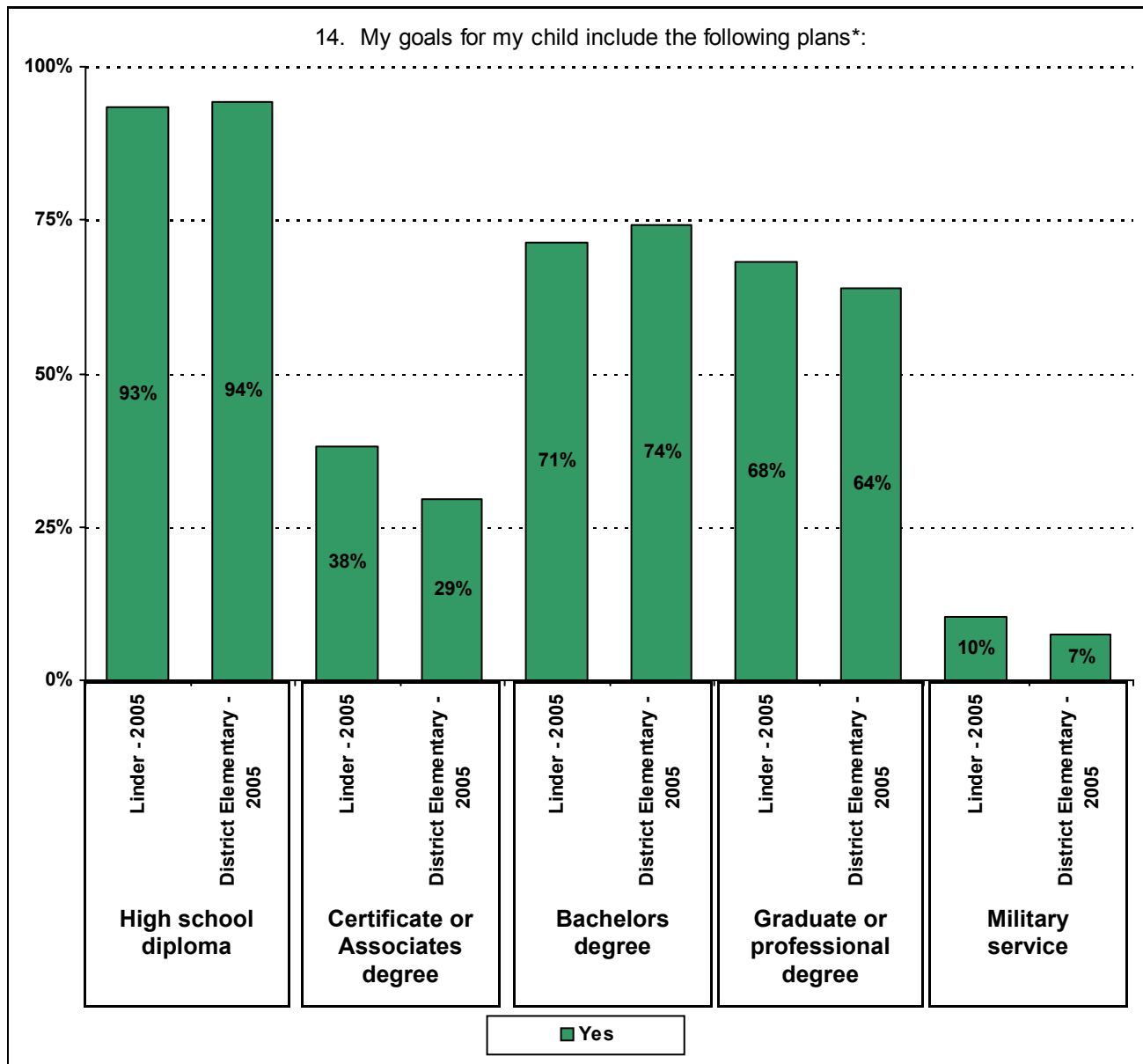
