


# AISD Student Climate Survey: Results for Spring 2014 Through 2017

#### **SMALL**

Evidence indicates that positive school climate fosters a positive learning environment for students. Also, researchers have documented that a positive school climate helps increase school success among students from economically disadvantaged schools (Voight, Austin, & Hanson, 2013). #### **Survey Results**


