



NEST STUDENTS TESTIFY BEFORE THE TEXAS STATE LEGISLATURE IN SUPPORT OF PREVENTION EDUCATION



After students asked why the Nest Curriculum wasn't available all across Texas, our partners at Deeds Not Words trained Nest alumni to lobby and testify in congress in support of a bill that would make sexual exploitation prevention education mandatory. Many students stayed on to give feedback on other bills that were under consideration by the House Education Committee in the Texas State Legislature.
