Why would that be considered indirect care? direct care is implementing services, i.e. medication administration. indirect care is the planning piece, i.e. placement of students with ADHD in the classroom What does 'unique student' mean? every student is unique, however 'unique student' means looking at all factors affecting a student's healthcare in that exact moment to individualize care Concern about treatment of students with 'behavioral health' marking them as 'high risk'.
