#### **Health Service Update**

- -Nursing Update
  - COVID cases reducing.
  - Seton provides nursing services to AISD schools. It's a unique model ensure staffing or all schools with RN or CA staff.
  - There are challenges with staffing: COVID has affected staffing as there are vacancies, but the goal is to have an RN or CA at each school.
  - Gold Standard: to have an RN at all campuses, but trained medical staff are made available at all campuses
  - Every school also has other staff trained in medical administration. These non-medical staff are designated by principals. There are about 8 schools without medical staff. We have more CA coverage: approx.. 60/40
  - Austin ISD no longer uses telehealth services.

Belynda: reported that a community clinic van goes to Akins HS – there is a \$10 copay for uninsured patients. This service was secured through a grant and should be pursued by other schools.

TCHATT is being utilized by some campuses regularly at 51 schools.

Goals for SHAC

- Making sex education, PE, etc. adaptable for spec. ed. students
- Orientation for new SHAC members

- Emergency services/national disasters
- Working on getting Narcan in every school; push for campaign
- Do we have drug curriculum?
- Substance abuse- addressing Fentanyl epidemic

Health Services is working on a Campaign to get Narcan in all schools, provide training for staff to administer, and education/awareness for parents and community. Support from staff, parents, and community is needed.

Narcan is a nasal spray that can be given to an individual experiencing an overdose. The goal is to have Narcan stocked in all schools, starting with high schools and middle schools. Staff do not need to be licensed to administer it. All CAs and RNs will be trained, as well as officers and other designated staff that can be trained. Austin ISD Police officers carry Narcan.

Narcan is costly and expires in 36 months so it must be purchased in an appropriate quantity and used in a timely manner.

The campaign will focus on Fentanyl right now, as the recent deaths due to Fentanyl in Hay Co. has made this a major public health issue to address at AISD. A new version of Fentanyl, called rainbow Fentanyl is very concerning and targets a younger age group.

Should Narcan be in lock boxes in designated stations in larger schools to better cover the campus rather than just at the Nurse's office

Austin ISD wants to treat usage/overdose of Fentanyl as a health concern vs. punishment from a police officer
