	Health Fairs (Coordinated School Health) – Pat said already these have already been happening and is different on each campus. Schools invite local providers on campus for events. ES and MS formed a committee on	

each campus for their family fun night or the specific name on each campus. All events are organized by volunteers and focused around what each campus needs. Allison asked if there are best practices in place with recommendations question from Allison. Pat said yes, all available on campuses. Nina asked if her proposal was looked at for Health Fairs. She has a feebased person that could coordinate every campus. Pat said mostly PE teachers handle their campuses. It happens organically on each campus based on what each school needs and is tailored to meet their specific needs. Nina said a survey could be used to help identify needs. Outdoor Learning and Mental Health Belynda provided an update on her Subcommittee's review of the Wellness policy. It sounds like SHAC is already doing the items in this policy. It's a 20 page document – generic in its presentation to satisfy requirements for food and PE. Very punitive – like a food police policy. Their recommendation is that the Wellness Policy be modified every 3-5 years using current groups already in place. There is too much language and oversight. Classroom birthday parties should be joyful. Teachers should not be using candy as a reward. Maybe recommend that there is only one party a week or per month. Coor Health survey will not go out this year. Edna Butts will be writing a new policy this year. Last done in 2017. Also revised in 2020 but there's no access to that document. Nina Miller – kids might already arrive at school with high sugar levels to start the day. Affects mood, behavior, lack of focus. Wants to improve awareness and reach out to principals to be on the same team. Suzanne asked about having more diversity on SHAC membership.
